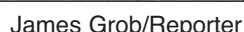

Northeast Iowa has been very blessed as far as favorable precipitation. It tapered off in some areas more than others, and we had a cooler August, that helped the stress on the plant."

Basol said earlier this month that the normal date for the first frost is Oct. 5, and the normal date for the first killing frost (28 degrees or colder) is Oct. 15.

At this point, the corn is mature enough that an early frost won't affect yields all that much.

Of course, this is one of those years when a "late first frost" seems likely; in fact, most forecast models as of Tuesday didn't show any potential frost for the next 15 days.

"If you're wondering about a worst-case scenario for farmers, I'd say a really bad windstorm before harvest would be a problem, or if it started raining out and wouldn't quit.

"That happened back in 2007 in north-west Iowa — it rained for about three weeks straight. That's a pretty tense situation for a farmer, knowing that your crop is ready to come out, but not being able to get out there and get it done."

Weather prognosticators are not predicting anything like that this year in northeast Iowa.

"From what I've seen, the long-term forecast is calling for above average temperatures, and just a little above average for precipitation, but nothing huge," Basol said. "If that's what happens, I'll say that I expect about an average yield this fall for both corn and soybeans."

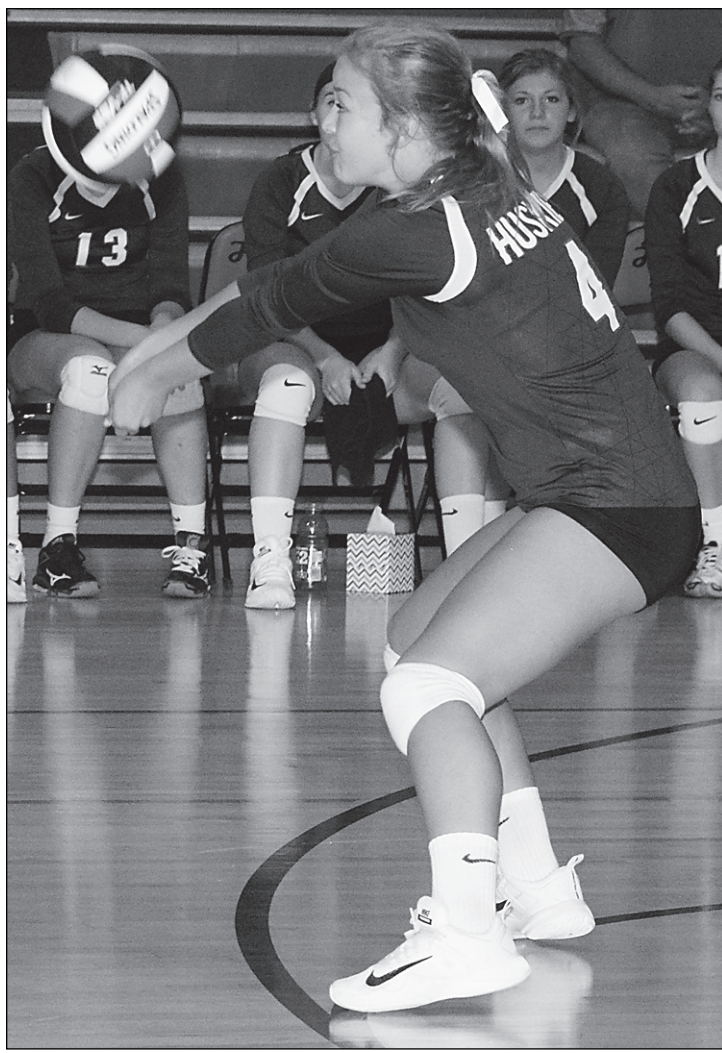

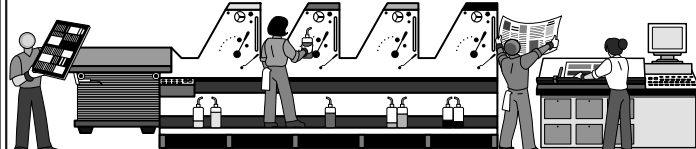

HUSKIES RALLY FOR WIN, SET UP HUGE GAME FRIDAY NIGHT

They took their lumps as sophomores and juniors to experience games as seniors like the one coming up on Friday.

Thanks to a come-from-behind 26-12 win over West Fork last Friday, Nashua-Plainfield will be playing its most meaningful game this late in the season since the Huskies advanced to the Class A state quarterfinals in 2014.
