## Supervisor suit dismissed

Judge rules against Johnson; Hackman says he's grateful for support

A New Hampton man's lawsuit against Chickasaw County and the supervisor who served as the chairman of the Board of Supervisors in 2020 was dismissed last week by a Howard County District Court judge.

Terry Johnson had filed the suit

against the county and Jacob Hackman over comments Hackman made during a meeting in August 2020, but District Court Judge Laura Parrish last Thursday issued a summary judgment to dismiss the suit.

"A district court has the power to correct its own errors prior to entry of final judgment," Parrish wrote in her ruling. "For the reasons stated in the

defendants' Dec. 21, 2022, motion and in oral arguments on June 12, 2023, the court finds the plaintiff has failed to generate a fact question for the jury on the issue of defendants' actual malice ... Plaintiff's position must be dismissed."

During Monday's Board of Supervisors meeting, Hackman spoke about the dismissal during the "public comment" portion of the meeting.

"I just want to take a minute to let everyone know that it's been dismissed," he said. "I want to thank everyone who believed in me and backed me to get this win for us. A big thank you goes out to Heartland Risk Pool for not backing down on me

[and] to my family, friends, legal team, co-workers and the citizens of this county for all of their support. We followed

Tupper says New Hampton reminds her a lot of her hometown in Nebraska

Moving to Chickasaw County presented a lot of positives to Amanda Tupper.

She and her husband, Michael, could actually live together. The move represented a "homecoming" of sorts for the Nebraska native. And she landed a job that she loves.

Tupper began work as the ISU Extension Chickasaw County director on June 8, and she has been, in a word, impressed.

"People in New Hampton and in the county have just been so welcoming," she said, "and we have a great staff here in the office. I know I've just started and we have some big things coming up but I'm excited about this job, excited about

## Nashua Area EMS gets state's blessing, goes into service

It's official: Nashua Area EMS is now in service.

After a process that was at times frustrating, the city's new ambulance service last week finally received what it needed — a state license — to begin answering calls, and "D-Day" for Nashua Area EMS was this past Saturday.

"He came yesterday, did his final inspection and gave us our certification," Nashua Area EMS Director Zenda Vikturek said last Wednesday. "We're all really excited because I know there are some people out there — just leave it at that — who have fought us every inch of the way."

Nashua Area EMS has been almost a year in the making.

For years, the city was part of the Chickasaw County Ambulance Council and received ser-

vice through a contract that the council had with Chickasaw Ambulance Service, a privately-owned company based in New Hampton.

Last summer, though, six of the county's cities — New Hampton, Bassett, Fredericksburg, Ionia, Lawler and North Washington — signed 28E agreements with Chickasaw County to receive service from a county-owned service, Chickasaw

## Hugeback-Johnson expands with its purchase of Conway-Markham

New owners say they expect a seamless transition; former owner expresses gratitude to area families who put 'trust in us'

Two of the area's oldest businesses are consolidating services after Friday's announcement that Hugeback-Johnson Funeral Home and Crematory had purchased Conway-Markham Funeral Homes.

The sale was announced Friday, and Hugeback-Johnson's Andy Hugeback and Drew Johnson both emphasized that they expect a seamless transition as they take over Conway-Markham's New Hampton and Elma locations.

"We want families to know that they can feel confident that all pre-arrangements will be honored in the same manner as their current contract," Hugeback said.

Conway-Markham owner Liz

Markham said the sale and her future plans made for "bittersweet excitement."

"I will be joining Mark in North Dakota as we begin our new adventure together," she said.

She added that there were a number of factors that led to the sale of the funeral home that traces its roots back to the late 1800s.

"Due to the current trends in the funeral profession and with the confidence of unifying our communities' funeral service, Mark and I, along with our families are entrusting the funeral homes to the Hugeback and Johnson families."

Hugeback-Johnson, which celebrated the 100th year of its founding in

2017, will now have funeral homes in New Hampton, Nashua, Fredericksburg, Waucoma and Elma. Bryan Hugeback returned to New Hampton in 1996 and took over from his father as owner and operator. In the past decade, both his son and son-in-law have become funeral directors.

Liz Markham's parents, Ron and Kris, purchased Conway-Markham in 2007, and Liz joined the staff in 2009. She purchased the funeral home from her parents several

years ago, and she said she would miss the interaction she has had with families over the past 14 years.

"On behalf of our family and staff, we wish to express our gratitude for your trust in us," she said. "It has always been our mission to provide thoughtful and caring service. If we've helped to lighten your burden, our mission has been accomplished."

She went on to add that she couldn't "thank my friends and family enough — especially my children — for your love, patience, and endless support."

Both Andy Hugeback and Drew Johnson said their funeral home will do everything it can to help Conway-Markham families through the transition.

The purchase also is a bit of a "homecoming" for Johnson, who grew up in Alta Vista, just a few miles from Elma.

"I'm looking forward to working with families I know and lived around when I was growing up," he said. "I think both Andy and I and our families are looking forward to this new chapter for the funeral home."

## Nashua Area EMS director grateful for all those that supported city ambulance

County EMS, that began service on Jan. 1.

Along with Alta Vista, which decided to contract with an ambulance based just a few miles from the city in Elma, Nashua balked at joining Chickasaw County EMS.

City leaders were not only concerned about the costs of the county service but also were adamant at the time that they would not join the county service unless an ambulance was based in Nashua.

When that guarantee was not made, the city decided to strike out on its own. Nashua paid \$10,000 to receive service from AMR, which has a contract with Floyd County and Charles City to cover the first six months of this year, but the city also began work on starting its own service. A used ambulance was purchased this past fall, a drive to have city residents become certified as EMTs and Vilkurek, who has worked in EMS for a number of years, was hired to serve as the director.

"I will tell you right now because I had always worked

being here and excited about being part of Extension again. ... One of the things I am really looking forward to is getting the word out about all we have to offer."

It's been a trip, that's for sure, when it comes to the last year of Tupper's life.

She and Michael, a 2014 graduate of New Hampton High School, got married but while she lived and worked for Nebraska Extension in Norfolk, her husband's base of operations for his job at John Deere was Bettendorf.

"We had a state and a half between us," she said with a laugh, "but somehow, we made it work. It wasn't something I wanted to do for a long, long time, put it that way."

So in March, the Tppers made a joint decision — let's move to New Hampton. Michael could realize his lifelong dream

## Supervisors begin work on budget amendment

Decisions made by board after budget certified necessitates amendment early in fiscal year

The Chickasaw County Board of Supervisors held their first meeting of the new fiscal year on Monday and went to work on amending the budget that was a mere 3 days old.

But it didn't come as a surprise to the county leaders, for they approved a number of purchases in recent months that they knew would require a budget amendment early in the fiscal year.

"We knew this was coming," Supervisor Jake Hackman said. "With what went on the last couple of months in the last fiscal year, a budget amendment has to be in the mix."

The board approved purchases ranging from \$209,372 for new in-car and body cameras for the Sheriff's Office to \$350,000 for a building to house Chickasaw County EMS to \$55,578 that were approved after the 2023-24 budget was certified in April.

That led board members on Monday to begin work on a budget amendment that will be published as a legal notice later this month.

Board members discussed a number of issues that they wanted to see cleared up.

Start with the Sheriff's Office purchase of the new cameras.

County Auditor Sheila Shekleton's worksheet showed an increase in expenses of \$209,372, but supervisors received clarification from

Sheriff Ryan Shawver that his office has received \$5,000 from the Iowa Governor's Traffic Bureau for the cameras and that he could take \$5,000 from his budget that had been earmarked for camera systems for a new vehicle.

"So we're talking \$199,000 and change," Hackman said. "I can live with that."

Supervisors also discussed any changes that would need to be made with the purchase of the building at 204 E. Prospect St. that will serve as the home for the county-owned ambulance service. Board members plan on using American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to buy the building from New Hampton residents Jeremy and Lacey McGrath.

But they also discussed how the county will pay for remodeling of that building so that it will have living quarters. Shekleton also asked board members about the \$50,000 supervisors voted to give the city of Nashua for dam repairs.

She pointed out that no written request has been received by the county for the \$50,000 that board members earlier this year said could be taken out of the interest the county's ARPA dollars have generated.

New Hampton resident Terry Johnson again asked the board to tap the brakes on the dam money.

"I think before the \$50,000 goes out for Nashua," he said, "there needs to be some reporting and some homework done

on that on who actually owns the property."

Monday's agenda item was for discussion purposes only and the supervisors are expected to take up the budget amendment in next week's meeting.


Also on Monday, the board approved a change in how the county's payroll will be processed. In effect, the county's elected officials will be paid "currently" while there will remain a one-week "lag" for all other county employees.

"Like when we got paid on Friday, the 30th, I could have left today and you would have owed me nothing," Shekleton said. "We just wanted to pay the payroll simpler for the deputies doing it ... We've had nothing on paper on here's how we do this."

County Attorney David Laudner admitted it was confusing — saying "it's a mess" — but that the county needed to proceed because under state law, elected officials need to receive their salaries during a particular fiscal year.

In the 2022-23 fiscal year, he pointed out that there were 27 "pay" periods, which caused issues.

"The problem was last year is that with the 27 pay periods, which is very odd, all the elected officials got paid on July 1, 2022, 1/27th of their salaries, which they only worked for one day of the fiscal year or been in office for one day of the fiscal year," he said. "The auditor said that's a no-no, paying someone basically in advance."



New Hampton wraps up 22-9 regular season with non-league wins over Oelwein, Wapsie

Fear the deer.

"Joe Buck" – antlers and all – is officially the New Hampton baseball team's newly christened mascot.

The Chickasaws can thank Decorah for the inspiration behind NH's peculiar looking rabbit's foot that was "adopted" into the New Hampton baseball family early last week after a journey up to Winneshiek County to play the final two games of the Northeast Iowa Conference slate on the Vikings' home field.

During the road trip, the Chickasaws' team bus witnessed one of Mother Nature's anomalies poking its head out from the ditch as their yellow automobile zoomed on down the roadway.

"We played Decorah and on the way there we saw a deer – an albino deer," said NH senior ace Gannon Shekleton.

To top it off, as far as wildlife encounters go – the Chickasaws were warming up on Decorah's field and another deer decided to make a visit near the ball diamond.

And "Joe Buck" – not the famous sports announcer – was "born."

This "Joe" – an actual deer decoy – has been omni-present in the Chickasaws' dugout since that last road contest of the season that saw New Hampton (22-9, 13-7) split with Decorah (16-14, 11-9) on Monday to snare second place in the always tough NEIC.

There's many factors – obviously – that go into why teams win or lose. Having a feel-good friendly hooved friend around to keep the mood light and lively is always a bonus. Not that New Hampton needed the positive force "Joe" has created in the clubhouse as the Chickasaws



have eight out of their last 10 games and are on a roll.

What is the key to success sometimes in the wacky world of baseball according to NH head coach Cory McDonald?

"A good luck charm is one of those," said McDonald. "Baseball luck does not hurt."

Neither does talent as New Hampton demonstrated by routing Oelwein at Mikkelsen Park by a score of 11-1 on Tuesday and then turned around a shut out a solid Wapsie Valley squad the following night on Wednesday, 4-0.

"Everyone's contributing," said Shekleton, who is tied for most wins on the season in Class 2A with eight. Shekleton is 8-0 and sports a microscopic 0.60 ERA.
