Supervisors buy third ambulance

Board unanimously votes to buy 'remounted' rig that Chickasaw EMS Director says should arrive by August

The saga of the third backup ambulance for Chickasaw County EMS came to an end Monday when the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved spending a little more than \$200,000 to purchase a "remounted" rig.

After a lengthy discussion that followed the opening of three bids for

used ambulances, board members agreed to use \$204,415 of the county's American Rescue Plan Act funds to purchase a 2023 chassis that will have a 2009 "ambulance box."

"It's great news for our service and for our county," Chickasaw County EMS Director Joel Knutson said after board members approved the purchase. "Anyone who has attended the meetings I've been at knows how

important I felt having a third ambulance was for the long-term viability of our service."

Since being named as the service's director last fall, Knutson has lobbied long and hard for the county to have a third "backup" rig to go with the two new ambulances that it purchased for the county-owned service that also provides service to the cities of New Hampton, Bassett, Fredericksburg,

Ionia, Lawler and North Washington.

Supervisors discussed purchasing three new vehicles last fall but ended up buying just two from Klocke's Emergency Vehicles. Over the course of several months, they turned down Chickasaw Ambulance Service owner Jeremy McGrath's offer to sell the county a 2003 ambulance and also

didn't act on other offers that came their way.

Earlier this month, though, the board OK'd Knutson to send out request for proposals to dealers to see

Council gives blessing for rehab housing

City will contribute \$52,000 to USDA Rural Development grant program

The New Hampton City Council on Monday agreed to contribute a little more than \$50,000 in an effort to help low-income residents make improvements to their homes in the city.

The council unanimously approved to provide matching funds to a U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Development's Housing Preservation Grant (HPG) and will use money the city has received from its Tax Increment Financing (TIF) Low- and Moderate-Income Set-Aside Fund.

"It's something the city has used before," City Clerk Karen Clemens said, "and that money in that TIF fund has to be used for projects like this."

The program will be administered by the Iowa Northland Regional Council of Governments (INRCOG), and Clemens said that means that while city officials will take in the applications, it will be INRCOG that will award the grants.

"They're the ones that will see if people qualify," Clemens said, "and in a small city, I think that makes it easier for people to apply for the program. It's a good program both for people who will get grants and for the city, too, because it improves our housing."

Those who receive the grants can use them for various qualifying projects that range from putting a new roof on a house to updating a home's heating system to replacing windows in a home.

"There are a variety of ways people can use the

The melancholy of graduation

As commencement nears, so, too, does the realization that time really does fly

The date was Aug. 18, 2010. It was a cool but muggy Wednesday morning as hundreds of New Hampton Elementary School students — many with their parents in tow — headed to the old building on Main and Linn to start another school year.

Mallory Cleveland was one of those kids. She was heading to kindergarten, and as Wes, Heather and Mallory crossed the street, the littlest Cleveland clung tightly to her father's hand.

A few minutes later, she was in teacher Sue Nossbisch's classroom, yet the grip never loosened.

Finally, it was time for mom and dad to say goodbye, and Mallory grabbed her father's leg and held on to it for dear life.

It was almost like she was thinking "I'm OK with going to school but no one told me Mom and Dad were leaving." I snapped a picture to capture the moment and while it wasn't the best shot, I figured it would make a nice addition to Mallory Cleveland's graduation bulletin board far into the future.

Seniors honored in today's paper and on Sunday

Turkey Valley kicks it off Sunday with a 1 p.m. program that will be held in the high school gym while New Hampton's commencement will begin at 2:30 p.m. in the competition gymnasium.

The future is now. On Sunday, Cleveland will confidently walk across the stage and receive her diploma, signifying the end of a journey that started on that August day so long

ago. And then she shall begin a new expedition.

I remember Aug. 18, 2010, like it was yesterday. Because, in some ways, it was.

When I take my spot Sunday afternoon in the competition gymnasium at New Hampton High School and begin shooting pictures, I may turn into a sentimental old fool, for this group of seniors — the Class of 2023 — is the first one I watched grow from kindergartners to young men and young women ready to walk into the so-called "real world."

Newspaper reporters will tell you that graduations never really change. The superintendent talks. The School Board president talks. A

New Hampton, Turkey Valley avoid the 'teacher shortage' heading into next year

Superintendent says New Hampton has just one or two positions to fill while Turkey Valley is '100 percent filled' heading into 2023-24

New Hampton Community Schools' top administrator is grateful that he won't have to experience a particular kind of deja vu this summer.

That's because the School Board on Monday night approved the hiring of a

number of certified staff members for the 2023-24 school year; in fact, save for a late resignation received from New Hampton High School English teacher Laura Roberts, Jurrens said the district's teaching staff is in place for next year.

Throw in that fact that the other district Jurrens heads, Turkey Valley,

is "100 percent filled," and the veteran superintendent is breathing a sigh of relief.

"All you have to do is look at last year, and you'll know why I'm smiling," he said, referring to the fact that New Hampton had to hire three "half-year teachers" in August to fill out its staff just days before the 2022-23

academic year commenced. "To go into the summer with just one unfilled position, honestly, not too many districts can say that right now."

Jurrens said he has a "backup plan" to fill the English opening, and he may have to use it because there are 161 English positions currently open on the "Teach Iowa" website.

"You want to talk about a teacher shortage," he said, "that's it right there. But we feel really good with where we're at right now, not only with the fact that we have teachers and staff in place but also the quality of those teachers and staff members."

TRIBE Trail nearing completion

Committee hopes to bid final phase this fall and have trail completed by summer of 2024

It's been a journey, that's for sure, but TRIBE Trail Committee member Megan Baltes believes the project she has devoted countless hours to is in its "final tunnel" and the light isn't the proverbial freight train but a completed trail.

"We're so appreciative of all the donors, and honestly, we're really close to finishing this up," she said. "To know, we're going be able to bid it this fall and to know by next year, that it will be done, it just shows the support we've received from the community."

The latest support came from two couples who have a long business history in the city as both Vern and Jean Laures and Mark and Kris Kramer handed over checks for \$15,000 to Baltes and New Hampton Parks and Recreation Director Tara Hackman.

"It's people like the Kramers and the Laures who are going to make this dream become a reality," Baltes said. "There aren't

enough thank yous to show our gratitude to everyone who has donated to the project throughout all the phases."

The first phase of the trail was built in 2017 and ran from Mikkelson Park to Garnant Park, ending at Logan Street. The second phase was built two years later and took the trail south of Logan and then west to Linn Avenue. The third phase will pick off where the second left off and end near the Chickasaw Wellness Complex and connect with the existing trail in New Hampton's west-side industrial park.

The third phase is estimated to cost just under \$764,000 and received a boost last spring when the New Hampton City Council agreed to give the trail \$200,000 of its American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to the project after an anonymous donor agreed to give \$100,000 if the city would commit the ARPA funds to the trail.

Since then, the TRIBE Trail has received a \$100,000 Community Attraction and Tourism (CAT) grant and a \$75,000 award from the REAP Foundation. The committee has also secured funds from the local

Hotel/Motel tax.

Baltes said the committee is still accepting donations for a variety of reasons, including:

- The committee is basing its Phase III costs off of an engineer's estimate but with the recent inflationary trend, the committee wants to make sure it has enough on hand to complete the trail.
- Trail supporters are also hoping to add amenities like a gazebo/rest area, benches, solar lamp posts and trash receptacles.
- Any money left over will be remain in a fund for trail maintenance.

Although the bids for Phase III of the trail won't be let until the fall, the committee does plan to "reseal" the industrial-park trail this summer.

"As much as we'd like to go to bid now," Baltes said, "we also know that it's best to bid in the fall because contractors are looking for work next year. We feel really confident, though, that we're really on the home stretch for what we think really adds to the quality of life for our community and our area."

School Board ratifies deal with district's support staff

Among those hired by the board Monday night were Michelle O'Donnell as the high school counselor, Raquel Schmitt for a second-grade teaching position, Joslyn Evanston as the elementary school counselor and Terry Bohr as an elementary special education teacher.

Jurrens said Tuesday that in addition to the English opening, the district may also try to hire one more special education teacher in the elementary because of the number of students who have behavior issues.

The board also on Monday approved the negotiated settlement with the New Hampton Education Association Support Group, which includes paraprofessionals, cooks, bus drivers and other non-teaching staff members.

The new contract represents a 5.4 percent increase to the district and means New Hampton will spend about \$138,000 more on its support staff in

2023-24 than it will this year.

In other news from Monday night's board meeting:

- Board members approved 5.1 percent raises for its building principals and office staff members who are not part of a union and also gave its transportation director and maintenance director 5.4 percent raises next year.

- The board, which last month approved hiring Orkin to help with bug problems at the elementary school, agreed to hire the company to help combat an ant issue in the cafeteria area at the high school and middle school.

“We’ve never had a single issue with ants since I’ve been here,” Jurrens said, “and then this year came around and who knows where they came from. It could be a lot worse, but we want to get ahead of the problem.”

- Board members also approved allowing New Hampton High School FFA members to attend an “officer’s retreat” in Wisconsin next month.

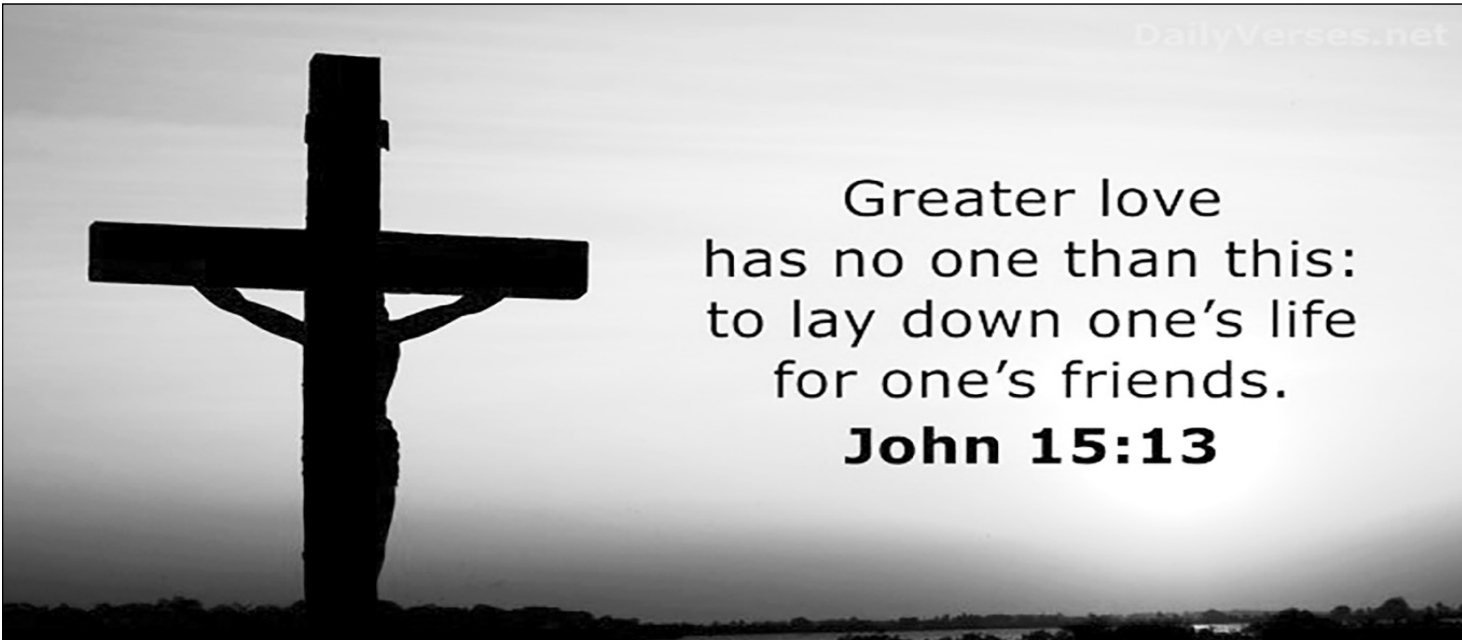

Four Ways To Use Cash Wisely

There has been a lot of talk about a “cashless” society, but it’s not here yet. In fact, cash can still be a valuable element of your overall financial picture — if you employ it wisely. But how? Consider these four key uses of cash:

- *Everyday spending* – Of course, you need sufficient cash on hand to pay for your cost of living — mortgage, debt payments, utilities, groceries, etc. You’ll likely rely on your savings or checking accounts to pay for these needs.

- *Unexpected expenses and emergencies* – It’s never a bad idea to establish a monthly budget. The value of these investments will fluctuate, so, if it’s possible, you’ll want to avoid selling them when their price is down — which may make them unsuitable for short term goals. But if you’re aiming for a goal that you want to achieve in a year or so — a wedding, a long vacation, and so on — you’ll want to be sure a specific amount of money is there for you when you need it. Consequently, you’ll want to put away cash for this type of goal, possibly in a short-term savings or investment vehicle that might pay somewhat higher interest than a regular checking/ savings

account.

- *Source of investment* – In regard to your longer-term investment strategy, cash can play two important roles. First, it can serve as its own asset class alongside others, such as stocks and fixed-income vehicles. Unlike these other asset classes — especially stocks and stock-based mutual funds — cash won’t fluctuate in value, so it can potentially help lessen the impact of market volatility on your portfolio. And second, having the cash available in your portfolio gives you the opportunity to quickly take advantage of other investment opportunities that may occur. And you may be able to use your existing investments to help replenish the cash in your portfolio. For example, if you choose to take stock dividends in cash, these dividends can be “swept” into your brokerage account and held there until you’re ready to invest them. (However, depending on your comprehensive financial strategy, it may be a good move to reinvest the dividends into the same stocks or stock funds.) Keep in mind that you won’t want your investment accounts to contain too much cash, since its purchasing power can erode because of inflation.

Third motion the charm for supervisors

if the county could land a used ambulance, and they received three bids that were opened on Monday.

Two were submitted by Klocke. One was for the remounted vehicle while the other was for a 2013 vehicle that had 250,000 miles on it. The third bid came from Arrow Ambulances, which offered the county a 2012 model with 144,000 miles on it.

“I don’t think I want to trust someone’s life with a vehicle with 250,000 miles,” Supervisor Steve Breitbach said, and his fellow board members seemed to agree as none of them voiced support for the vehicle. “I’d be in favor of the 2023 chassis. We know that vehicles are going to keep going up in value, or cost. I think we should spend the money now and have a decent vehicle for the future.”

The bids ranged from \$22,500 for the high-mileage vehicle to \$89,900 for the Arrow rig to \$150,000 for the remount, but when the cost of putting in a power-load cot system and cot were added, the bids received ranged from \$76,915 to \$204,415. Supervisor Travis Suckow asked Knutson if the backup rig would need the power-load cot system, and the director said the “honest answer [is] no.”

But Knutson also pointed out that having the third rig with a power-load system would allow the service to “switch out parts” if it needed to do so and also pointed

out that purchasing the power-load system could be paid by just one Worker’s Compensation claim.

Knutson also said that no matter which rig was purchased, a cot would have to be bought.

“The most you’re saving is \$27,000,” he said, “and I think the advantages of having a power-load are worth that.”

Supervisor Scott Cerwinski made a motion to purchase the remounted vehicle “to be housed in Fredericksburg when not needed.”

County Attorney David Laudner, though, cautioned the board about making the housing in Fredericksburg part of the motion.

He said a “cleaner” way for the supervisors to have a vehicle in the second-largest city in the ambulance service’s area would be to approve the purchase of the vehicle and then have a motion in which the supervisors stated their intent to house a vehicle in Fredericksburg.

That motion was voted down, and Cerwinski then made a second motion — one that was contingent on the board approving a budget amendment.

Again, Laudner had concerns about basing a purchase on a budget amendment, and after former Auditor Joan Knoll told the board that it might not need an amendment until much later in the fiscal year, that motion was voted down.

Breitbach then made the motion to pur-

chase the remounted vehicle without any language about where it would be housed or being subject to a budget amendment. Cerwinski seconded it and all five supervisors voted to go ahead with the purchase.

Knutson said there are a number of reasons he feels Chickasaw County EMS needed a third vehicle, including the fact that it allowed the service the ability to take more inter-facility transfers from MercyOne New Hampton Medical Center.

“The bottom line is if we hit a deer tomorrow and it takes three weeks to get it fixed,” he said following the meeting, “that’s three weeks where we’re out when it comes to transfers. And I’ve said it over and over, but that’s a huge hit to our revenue, of any ambulance service’s revenue.”

The vehicle is expected to be delivered to the county late this summer.

One question that remained unanswered Monday was where the service will eventually be based permanently.

Knutson and board members went into closed session for about 45 minutes to “discuss the potential sale or purchase of real estate” but when they returned to open session, Board Chairman Matt Kuhn said there was no action going to be taken by the board.

Currently, Chickasaw County EMS is renting garage space from the city of New Hampton and its first crew is being housed at a rental home in the 200 block of South Walnut Avenue.

While in school, Roger met the love of his life, Karen Galligan. After completing his education, Roger began farming and working with Meirick Construction.



Charles City looking to build new high school

The Charles City Community School Board approved petition language for a high school facilities and auditorium bond referendum during its regular board meeting held on Monday, May 8.

The petition question will ask voters in the district to call for a referendum on a general obligation bond of up to \$28,500,000 to go toward both renovations to the high school building and the addition of a new auditorium.

If holding a vote is approved and then voters pass the referendum, it would authorize the district to levy up to \$2.70 per \$1,000 in assessed taxable valuation for up to 20 years to pay down the project, though it was noted that several factors such as refinancing and the use of PPEL funds once the middle school is paid off could mitigate that rate or timeframe.

The petition language was approved by unanimous vote by the board, including board member Dr. David Schrodt, who voted against a similar petition in last year's attempt at moving forward with a bond referendum due to his concerns about the tax increase it would entail.

With the petition language approved, the board can start the process of collecting signatures to bring the matter to the voters. While there had previously been debate on whether or not the ballot measure should be done in September of this year or March of next year, new state legislation signed into law last week has made the debate a moot point as now all bond referendums must be voted on in the November election.

On Tuesday, May 23, the school board will be hosting a work session with Matt Gillaspie of Piper Sandler & Co. to go over the finance details of the referendum. The community is encouraged to attend.

money,” Clemens said, “and again, it’s INRCOG and not us that makes sure that the money is being used as it’s intended.”

The Council approved taking \$52,000 from its TIF fund, and the USDA will match the council’s contribution. That means about \$104,000 could be awarded to New Hampton residents before the program comes to an end. Clemens said the city’s income-based TIF account has a balance of around \$75,000 “so we’re definitely able to afford this without draining that account.”

Also on Monday, the City

Council accepted the resignation of police officer Nick Sylvester, who is currently attending Hawkeye Community College’s police program.

Sylvester was hired in December and has spent much of his time with the city receiving training, and Clemens said that under an agreement Sylvester signed after he was hired, he will have to repay the city \$8,665.90 for the cost of his schooling, equipment and other expenses the city incurred since hiring him.

Council members also gave Police Chief Tim Pederson the go-ahead to begin advertising for Sylvester’s position.

Team effort delivers Chickasaws a team title at 2A qualifier

with how everything went,” New Hampton coach Jeanette Laures said after her team scored 115 points to best Denver by four for the state qualifier team banner. “When you have a group of kids who are well rounded, [winning the team title] is certainly a goal, and we told our girls, this team title was really a team effort. Everyone who competed made it to state or PR’d. You can’t ask for much more than that.”

When the New Hampton bus pulled out of Osage late Thursday night, the Chickasaws had locked up six events for state as senior star Carlee Rochford won the long jump, high jump and 100 hurdles, Pesek had taken second in the 100, Claire Geerts had finished as the runner-up in the shot put and Kinsley Hackman to Rochford to Taylor Ries to Pesek had taken second in the 4x400.

Friday, the Chickasaws learned that four more events had qualified based on time as the sprint medley (Hackman, Madison Shawver, Ries and Pesek), the 4x800 (Natalie Nosbisch, Megan Pickar, Ella Knutson and Tegan Dungey), Ries in the 400 hurdles and Pesek in the 200 had also punched tickets to Des Moines, where the state meet begins its three-day run this afternoon (Thursday).

“It’s always a little nerve-wracking waiting to see if you’re going to get to go,” Pesek said. “I felt really good about the sprint medley and even the 200, but until you actually see it on paper, it’s kind of scary.” Ditto for her coach.

“We thought all four of them were pretty safe,” Laures said, “but you never know. You’re always hoping for a few more – that’s just human nature – but 10 events is really good and we’ll take it.”

No one had a better day than Rochford, who won the high jump with what’s for her a pedestrian jump of 5-2.

“Once she knew she won it, we’re like let’s leave it at that because she had a busy night,” Laures said.

Rochford then easily won the long jump with a leap of 18-0.5, the second best in her stellar career, and then cruised to a win in the 100 hurdles. Her time of 15.28 was just .06 seconds off her school record, and considering she won the race by almost three-quarters of a second, it was a brilliant time. “You know with Carlee that you’re always going to get some outstanding performances,” Laures said. “Carlee obviously is super talented, but what people don’t see is all the work she puts in during the summer, during the offseason.”

The veteran coach paused for a moment and then touched on the intangible that not only makes Rochford one of the best track athletes in Iowa but is also the reason she’s heading to the University of Iowa as an heptathlete.

“She’s just so super competitive,” Laures said. “That’s something you can’t teach, that competitiveness makes here even more special.”

But there are good stories up and down New Hampton’s state track contingent.

Take Geerts, for example,

who learned last summer that she has a brain tumor, yet the diminutive junior is off to her first state meet.

“I’m happy, really, really happy,” Geerts said Thursday night. “My goal was to make it. I didn’t really care how far I threw it, I just wanted to be first or second.”

“I’m so happy for her, just because she’s been through so much,” Laures said. “You can’t ask for a better girl, a better teammate. She’s earned this, and we’re thrilled for her.”

Then again, Laures was pretty much thrilled with everyone.

New Hampton “double scored” in four events – the 400 (Nosbisch and Pickar), the 400 hurdles (Reis and Knutson), the high jump (Rochford and Kirsten Reicherts) and the discus (Madison Schaufenbuel and Kandice Eggerichs).

“That’s how you win meets as a team,” Laures said. “Everyone has to chip in, and everyone did on Thursday.”

But New Hampton wants more. Just ask Pesek, who ran a 58-second split in that sprint medley.

“We don’t want to just go there, we want to bring home some medals,” she said. “It’s great getting to state, but you can’t just be happy with that. You’ve got to want more.”

That’s music to Laures’ ears, who has two goals for her team this week in Des Moines.

“Obviously, we want to PR in as much as possible,” she said, “but I think a good goal for this team is to score more points than we did a year ago.”

In 2022, New Hampton scored 20 points, and that is a very attainable goal for this group of Chickasaws.

“I want them to have fun, I want them to enjoy the experience,” Laures said, “and the best way to do that is to go out and put together your best performances of the year.”

think,” said Ewert.

TV will look to lower its already school-best time of 1:36.86 at state this week. Central Springs was a close second in 1:37.02.

The Trojans will have the 10th-fastest qualifying time headed into the event, which will be run first thing Saturday morning at Drake Stadium in Des Moines.

The Trojans may have to go even lower than that school-record time to medal in the event. The amazing part of that relay’s performance was one of the handoffs of the baton was less than perfect.

“We overcome some adversity with some difficulties with the handoffs, but Franzen and Noah picked us up. Troy picked us up, too,” said TV senior Chase Hayek, who ran the second leg.

Troy Schmitt, who will have to be one of the most physically imposing leadoffs (he lifts weights in his spare time) in any relay down at state, regardless of class, will put a finish to his prep athletic career down at the blue oval.

It was Franzen’s finish, though, that pulled his team on through to victory.

“He was absolutely smoking,” said Hanson.

That sprint med won’t be the only event TV will run in down in Des Moines.

TV’s 4x400 relay took first place in a time of 3:32.49 – also a season-best – with Hanson, Hayek, junior Burke Busta and Franzen.

TV’s 4x200 relay came up just short of cracking the state field. The group

Franzen has a good shot to medal in the open 400 as well as he reeled in a gold medal in that race with a time of 51.54 – a PR. Franzen has the 11th-quickest qualifying time in 1A.

Hanson qualified for state in the 100 dash (11.66) – which he won at districts. He clipped Nashua-Plainfield freshman Navarii Williams at the tape. The Husky ran an 11.73.

“I got him by about a step-and-a-half,” said Hanson. “I got there. I got ‘er done.”

The TV girls just missed out on two events – the 100 dash with freshman Morgan Wenthold and the 4x100.

Wenthold placed third in the 100 dash in 13.27.

The 4x100 relay of Ryann Schmitt, Olivia Snyder, Jenna Thronson and Wenthold – who anchored the race – ran a 53.15.

Olivia Snyder, a senior, placed fifth in the 100 dash in 13.43. She competed at state in that event as a sophomore.

The state takes each winner of an event in Class 1A as an automatic entrant into the state meet. Then the next 16-best times, jumps or throws fill out the 24-person fields in each state event.

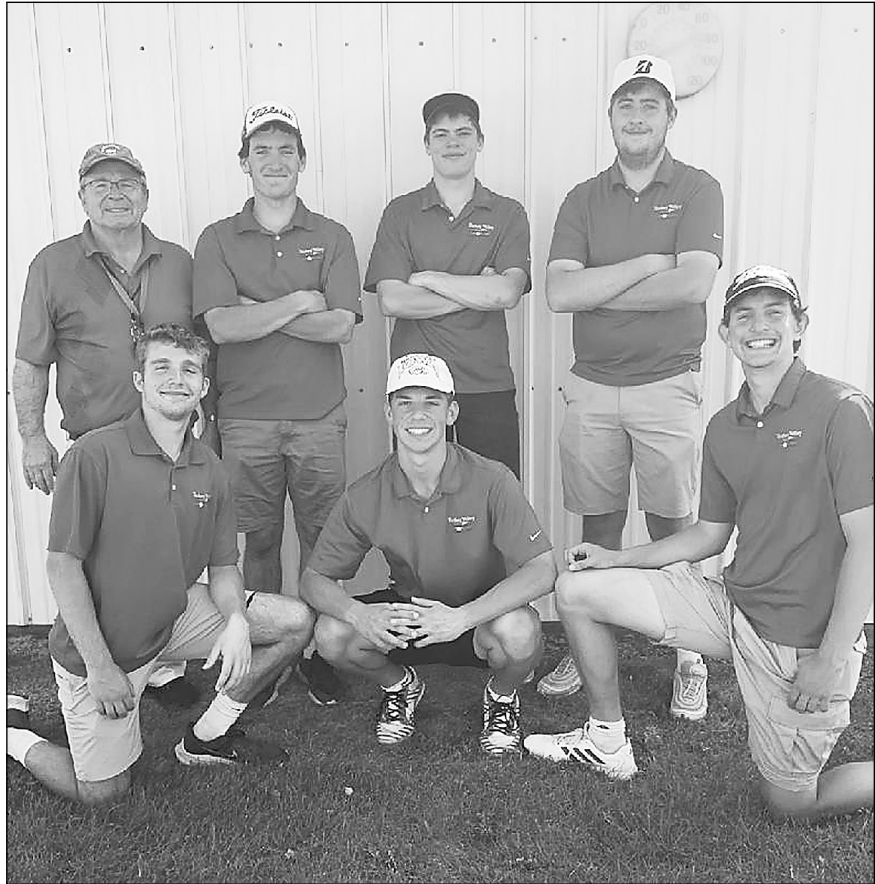

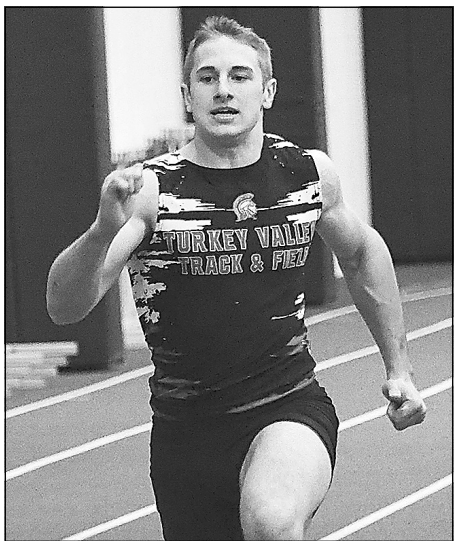

New Hampton boys suffer heartbreak on the track at qualifier

Hampton coach Scott Jenkins said after his team finished fifth in the team standings. “It’s part of our sport, I get that, but man, for guys like Maui, Robie, P.J. ... it’s certainly not where we wanted it to end, but saying all that, man, we did have some positives. We had a lot of them, in fact.”

Start with Zeien, the junior who had been in somewhat of a slump since getting off a throw of 162-2 at New Hampton’s coed last month. Yes, he qualified for the Drake Relays, and yes, he had been solid, but since that big throw, he had cracked 140 just once.

“I knew I had to relax, I knew I had to be prepared and, honestly, I knew I had it in me,” he said, “but I had to be prepared.”

So the Sunday before the qualifier, he grabbed a discus or two and made the drive to Osage. Although the Chickasaws had competed there this season, Zeien missed the meet because he was attending the State FFA Convention.

“I just wanted to see it, throw in it and be prepared,” he said, “and I think it helped me a lot.”

And it turned out he and his fellow throwers had themselves a night at the qualifier. Not only did Zeien earn a trip to state, but senior Carsyn Leistikow finished seventh with a career-best throw of 127-0. The Chickasaws also “double scored” in the shot put as senior Logan Peterman finished fourth with a career-best 43-6.5 while Zeien was sixth with a toss for 42-10.5.

“To place two in both events, to see seniors like Petey and Barkley finish like that,” Jenkins said, “that’s really special.”

Unfortunately, the track was filled with heartbreak for the Chickasaws, at least when it came to getting to state.

And it started with the first event as Beau Serie, Carter Cahoy, Braden McShane and Hunter Serie ran a season-best time of 1:37.60 in the sprint medley, only to come up one-tenth of a second behind Osage for second place, and when the rest of the state meet field was announced on Friday, New Hampton was on the outside looking in.

The Chickasaws also got a third-place finish from the distance medley relay team of Aiden Roberson, McShane, Hunter Serie and Peyton Anderson in a season-best time of 3:48.29. Anderson ran the mile, the 1,600, in 4:50.77, a career-best time by more than 10 seconds, to finish fourth, the same place the 4x200 team — the Serie brothers, Cahoy and McShane — finished.

“You see a Maui and how far he came this year,” Jenkins said of Hunter Serie, “and you can’t help but hurt. Guys like him, Robie and Peyton, they’ve done everything we asked of them. They’ve worked hard, they’ve been great teammates and you’d do just about anything for them to get to run at state. Sometimes, it’s just not meant to be.”

Anderson, who was injured in a spring baseball game last month, was philosophical about the end of his track career.

“I’m not going to say I’m not disappointed,” he said, “but being part of the track team, that’s something no one can take away from me. I loved it. Had a lot of fun and I don’t regret it at all. I know I gave it my all. I know a lot of the guys did. We don’t have anything to hang our heads about.”

Jenkins agreed, pointing out that both Ethan Praska and

Dylen Schmitt ran career-bests in the open 400 and that Praska lowered his 400 hurdles PR by almost two seconds.

“We’ve got some really good kids coming back, and if they put some time into this, there’s no reason they can’t go next year,” he said. “We saw a lot of positives, just not a lot of trips to Des Moines.”

For one Chickasaw, though, the season continues, and Zeien said his goal is return to New Hampton with a medal, preferably one for a seventh-place finish or better.

His former teammate, Cael Leistikow, place eighth in the discus in 2021. And that’s his target, at least for now.

“I told Cael I was coming for him,” he said with a laugh. “Honestly, the fact that I got to throw at Drake I think is huge for me. I’ve got the jitters and the nerves out of the way. I want to enjoy it, but I think Drake I was just that happy-to-be-there kind of thing. This time, I want to show something.”

NEW HAMPTON BOYS FIRE A 298 TO WIN CLASS 2A SECTIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

All season long, the members of the New Hampton boys golf team said it over and over.

One of these days, they were all going to put it together on the same day.

And that day turned out to be Wednesday as the Chickasaws rebounded from a disappointing Northeast Iowa Conference meet to fire a round for the ages, a 298, to claim the Class 2A sectional title at the New Hampton Golf and Country Club.

“We’ve had guys shoot great rounds almost every meet,” junior Kyler Glenn said, “but it was like one or two guys would play great and one or two guys would struggle. We knew we had it in us, and today, it just all came together.”

New Hampton’s win was impressive on a number of levels. It won the team title by two strokes over defending state champion Hudson. It missed setting a school record by just two strokes. And it came in a tournament that had plenty of quality. New Hampton’s previous best 18-hole score was a 323 and that would have placed the Chickasaws fourth in Wednesday’s sectional.

Glenn and fellow junior Jack Shawver led the way for the Chickasaws as they both fired rounds of 1-under-par 71. Another junior, Kam Josephson, also scored a career-low round of 78, a score matched by sophomore Adam Ewert.

The blazing round came two days after New Hampton struggled to a 334 at the NEIC meet.

“I don’t think any of us felt

Forest City after this edition of the Tribune went to press. Crestwood shot a 413 but because New Hampton, the host team, finished in the top-two of the first round, the Cadets earned a trip to the final round.

The key, Olson believed, for the Chickasaws was that they were ready for a rainy day.

“Well, that’s why we practice when it’s not ideal weather wise,” the veteran coach said. “First of all, you’re never going to practice in Iowa in the spring if you wait for ideal weather. Seriously, though, I give credit to all the girls because they were prepared. They had rain gear, they had umbrellas, they had towels, they had extra socks. This district featured the cream of the crop, as a slew of top teams in the state — including New Hampton — traversed the large greens at Dike-New Hartford's home course.

While the Chickasaws didn't play bad — the NEIC squad
