Geerts claims win in New Hampton mayor race

Longtime public servant tops Schwickerath, Schmitt and will take over city's top post at the beginning of the year

When the new year rolls around, New Hampton is going to have a new mayor.

Voters in Chickasaw County's largest city gave Steve Geerts a relatively easy victory in a three-candidate race during Tuesday's general election.

Unofficial results showed that

Geerts received 336 votes, or 44.2 percent of the votes, to oust incumbent Bobby Schwickerath, who was seeking a second term as New Hampton's mayor. Schwickerath garnered 217 votes, or 28.5 percent, while Melanie Schmitt was the choice of 203 voters, or 26.7 percent.

"It's going to be a new challenge," said the 68-year-old Geerts, who has been a lifetime resident of New

Hampton, "but it's one I'm really looking forward to. I think my experience was a big plus, and I'm happy and grateful that the voters put their trust in me. We have a great city, and I just want to do my part to keep it that way."

During the campaign, Geerts touted his leadership skills he has honed over the years in the Jaycees, as the owner and operator of a plumbing and

heating business, as a county supervisor for two terms and as the New Hampton fire chief for more than 24 years.


"I'm guessing that people saw all those things as a plus," he said, "and I know I have some training to do but I'm ready to go, I'm ready to help our city tackle the challenges we face."

What wasn't known Tuesday night, though, is who two of the three new council members will be.

Liz Zweibohmer hit the nail on the head Monday afternoon – proverbially speaking.

There was no hammer driving a thin piece of metal into wood and a construction project wasn't underway – just to be clear. But the New Horizons Chamber director couldn't help

but overstate the obvious after New Hampton's Holiday Open House saw shoppers come out in droves on Saturday to check out scores of stores in the downtown area.

"Honestly, the weather could not have been any better," said Zweibohmer. "It was so perfect."

By almost all accounts, the pre-Christmas showcase of what New Hampton has to offer in

terms of businesses citywide, not to mention all the fun and exciting things taking place all over town – was a smashing success.

The temperature – which threatened to reach a balmy 60 degrees on the first week of November – didn't hurt.

"As I walked downtown it was just so fun to

City told senior rate for garbage bins not OK

Council members vote to have city pick up costs for first two months that bins will be used

New Hampton is still going to move to bins when it comes to garbage pickup, but the City Council learned Monday night that the city can't give its senior citizens a discount.

That led council members to approve having the city use its Solid Waste Fund to pay for the first two months of garbage collection once the bins replace the yellow trash bags on Dec. 1.

Mayor Bobby Schwickerath said that City Clerk Karen Clemens had talked to the State Auditor's Office and "was advised not to pursue this pricing method" because of concerns about the legality of offering a select group of residents a discount.

During the City Council's meeting on Oct. 2, Jendro Sanitation General Manager Chris Kehoe presented what he called a "unique agreement" to push the city to use bins for garbage pickup. Under his proposal, residents would receive a 64-gallon container and be charged \$15.09 a month, but those 65 and older would pay \$7.49 for the container. Council members voted to move ahead with the bin system that night.

But after receiving the news from the State Auditor's Office, Schwickerath and Clemens both reached out to Kehoe.

"I did receive an email from Chris late this afternoon," Clemens said, "because I threw out the option – actually the auditor at the state suggested it – possibly they do a twice-a-month pickup, thinking of those people who don't set out a lot of garbage. ... It got met with a pretty

New Hampton grad's naval career soars

Riley takes over command of Navy Air Test and Evaluation Squadron ONE

He's done it a million times — OK, to be a little more accurate, he's done it 630 times — but every time U.S. Navy Capt. John Riley lands on an aircraft carrier, he experiences a rush few of us can imagine.

"What's it like to land on a carrier? Well, let me tell you," Riley said, "it's pretty much like crashing a car. You're really moving, you hit the carrier and you come to a stop in two seconds. It's not for everyone, I know that, but it's an amazing experience for a guy like me."

Riley has come a long way from his days as a New Hampton High School student-athlete who played three sports for the Chickasaws before graduating with the Class of 1995. He has

The engineer who assisted the TRIBE Trail Committee with the bidding process for the third and final phase of construction on the trail delivered "fantastic" news to the City Council on Monday evening.

During a meeting in which the city awarded a contract to Wick's Construction for \$576,732, to complete the trail next summer, SEH's Becky Schwab told council members that Wick's "actually came in about 21 percent under the engineer's estimate, which is fantastic for

see how many people were out and about. A lot of the stores I went into were packed. The vendor shows were awesome. I even saw a ton of out-of-town people," said Zweibohmer.

The tradition in New Hampton to get a head start on Christmas shopping, get some great deals at the same time and check out what's new downtown went off with nary a hitch. A large contingent of shoppers – mainly women, mind you – soaked in the unseasonably warm weather and helped support their community by shopping locally.

That meant hundreds of shoppers broke out the pocketbook and had a good time in the process.

"It's a ladies day out," said Pat Weigel, who helped organize the first Pub Craft Crawl at various bars downtown about a decade ago.

Weigel set up shop at Butch's Place to sell her goods and Dak's Tap also held a Pub Craft Crawl.

There was a whole lot more going on over the weekend than just a downtown shopping extravaganza for folks that even drove a considerable distance to experience just how vibrant and varied the downtown business district is.

"I always love this weekend. You start to get in the mindset of holiday shopping," said Zweibohmer.

The Maker's Market at the St. Joseph's Community School Parish Center featured a wide variety of vendors and even had live music. Ryne Lynn Owen, who sings for the Wapsi River Ramblers (a band out of Elma), strummed on his guitar and played many memorable tunes for the folks in attendance that strolled on through the gymnasium. They made sure to stop and purchase a whole host of different products as well.

A fall and winter craft show took place at the Chickasaw Event Center. That venue held a breakfast and lunch fundraiser as well.

A make and take craft and cocoa event was offered at the New Hampton Public Library and the New Hampton Country Club – east of town – featured lunch specials that drew a decent out-of-town crowd according to Zweibohmer.

TWO STORES – REBEL

Diamonds and Pocketful of Posies – celebrated milestone moments that highlighted their historical significance to New Hampton.

Pocketful of Posies – a full-service floral shop owned by Kayla Smith – saw their door constantly opening and closing during their grand re-opening. The business celebrated 40 years of operation on Oct. 1.

"We downsized our retail space. We were in the building next door. We just moved into this location two months ago, actually," said Smith, who has been owner since 2018.

Smith's business offered discount on store items, wine-tasting and handed out roses to mark the special occasion.

"That's just a thank you for sticking with us through our transition," said Smith.

Smith said she is the third owner of Pocketful of Posies in its long run of serving customers in New Hampton. She said the store has added wedding rentals where interested parties can use linens and separations for parties.

"The reason for moving was downsizing the retail. I want to be able to focus on flowers and plants more than the giftware – to hopefully extend more into wedding and event floral," said Smith.

Smith said the foot traffic was nice, but she was a tad concerned her new location might not handle all the people that made their way into her small, yet quaint store.

"I'm impressed with the amount of people that we have in here. We were afraid moving directly off of Main St. was going to hurt us, but today has proved that that's not going to happen," said Smith.

REBEL DIAMONDS – RUN

by owner Stacey Marr-Frahm – held its grand opening. The jewelry store – once owned by longtime New Hampton business owners Howard and Marty Wilshire – has been in operation in New Hampton since 1870. Wilshire's Jewelry Store was the previous business at Rebel Diamond's location. Two families had run a jewelry store in that exact same location prior to the Wilshire's taking over, making it the oldest retail operation in New Hampton.

"We opened in their same space, but this is much smaller," said Marr-Frahm, who like Smith, graduated from New Hampton High School.

Marr-Frahm lives in Stewartville, Minnesota and drives about an hour to New Hampton to open up the doors to her business that she started when she was working in Chicago. Rebel Diamond was born five years ago and was a private jewelry business, where Marr-Frahm met 1-on-1 with people to meet her customer's demands.

"At that time I was working in downtown Chicago for a diamond wholesaler," said Marr-Frahm. "I did Rebel in conjunction or on the side if you may."

While Rebel Diamond was created in 2018 – Marr-Frahm went on a sabbatical for two years when she worked at another jewelry store.

"We officially relaunched Sept. 19 of this year," said Marr-Frahm.

Marr-Frahm has returned to her roots with a business at a familiar location that is looking to remain strong in the community – just like it has done for over 150 years.

"My heart's been in jewelry for many, many years. I'm excited to be back in my hometown," said Marr-Frahm. "New Hampton is a diamond in the rough in my opinion."

How did the relaunch go on Saturday?

That was an easy answer. "Marty did say the traffic here today has been triple what it was in the past," said Marr-Frahm. "The community and Main St. of New Hampton is starting to grow and thrive."

Marr-Frahm summed up a day that means a lot to the businesses of New Hampton – not to mention its residents that support it.

"I've been around the block and the people here are one-of-a-kind," said Marr-Frahm. "The most important thing to me or what drives me is the relationship with the customer. I just love people. I love the human connection."

Veterans Day is special for Navy captain

seen the world and then some — flying more than 50 combat sorties — as he has risen through the ranks of the most powerful Navy in the world.

Yet, he takes a little — maybe a lot even — of New Hampton wherever he has gone — be in the skies above Iraq or as the new commander of an elite Navy unit, the Air Test and Evaluation Squadron One.

“I’m glad I grew up in New Hampton, and I can tell you right now, that growing up in a small town taught me a work ethic and an integrity that has helped me throughout my career,” the son of Steve and Deb Riley said. “I don’t think I’d be where I’m at today if I hadn’t grown up in New Hampton. No, scratch that, I know I wouldn’t be where I’m at.”

In some ways, Riley’s love of flying is in his blood. His grandfather, Al Riley, was one of the New Hampton residents who was instrumental in building the New Hampton Municipal Airport in 1946 and several of Riley’s uncles have also enjoyed piloting planes.

“I was 10, maybe even younger,” Riley said, “and I knew I wanted to fly. Grandpa, my uncles ... I guess I wanted to be like them ever since I could remember.”

AFTER GRADUATING from New Hampton High, he headed to Iowa State University with an ROTC scholarship, but make no mistake about it, the dream was to fly for the Navy.

After graduating in 2000, he was commissioned as an officer and pursued his dream of being a Navy pilot. His dream was realized after two years of training at Pensacola, Florida, and Norfolk, Virginia as he received his naval flight officer wings of gold in March 2002.

That began an adventure, that he will, that has lasted for more than 21 years and continues to this day.

He served on the USS Kitty Hawk during the American invasion of Iraq in 2003; in fact, he was in the air the night U.S. forces pounded Iraqi forces and positions at the beginning of the war.

“It was really shock and awe,” he said, “and there’s really no other way to describe it. ... I’ll be honest, I was nervous at first, but then we were flying all the time, eight hours a day, and after a while, I was too busy and too tired to be scared. You just do your job, you know?”

He has served numerous sea assignments during his career; in fact, he estimates he’s been “away from home” for what amounts to years.

RILEY, THOUGH, HAS been blessed by a supportive family. He married his wife, Tina, on Sept. 15, 2001, four days after the 9-11 attacks on the World Trade Center and the Pentagon.

The couple has three children — 15-year-old Logan, 13-year-old Mason and 10-year-old Grace — and Riley will be the first to tell you that he hit one out of the ballpark when it comes to his wife.

“She’s put up with a lot,” he said, “and I know I keep saying it, I wouldn’t be here without her. The unsung heroes of the American military are the spouses and children. Civilians just really don’t understand — they can’t understand — what military families have to deal with, and I’ll say it forever, I have the best wife and the best kids who have been right behind me the whole way.”

In addition to his five or six deployments, he has also had his share of shore assignments, and Riley particularly loves the one he is currently serving.

He arrived at Naval Air

The American Legion Fae Stine Post 38 will hold its annual Veterans Day program on the 11th hour of the 11th month — in other words, at 11 a.m. this Saturday.

The program will be held at the Chickasaw County Veterans Memorial and will feature Pastor Scott Smith of the Fredericksburg UCC as the keynote speaker.

The program will also include music from the New Hampton High School Band, an invocation and benediction by Pastor Anthony Harris of the Harvest Church and the traditional salute by the Legion post’s Firing Squad.

On Sunday, the post will hold its annual Pork Chop Dinner from 4 to 7 p.m. at the Pub at the Pinicon.

Tickets are \$15 and available at the New Hampton Municipal Utilities building that is located just across the street from the downtown Kwik Star.

Proceeds from the dinner will go to various Legion programs.

“I do feel like I couldn’t ask for a better assignment,” he said. “I get to command a great squad and I can put myself on the flight line at any time. I still love flying, and I don’t think that love is ever going to go away.”

VETERANS DAY is on Saturday, and Riley was asked what the holiday means to him as an active military member.

“It’s a huge day for me, really it is for a lot of the men and women who are serving,” he said. “We get to honor those who went before us. We know what they went through, we know the sacrifices they made, and it’s a day I hope most Americans will always cherish.”

One day, he will go from Navy officer to veteran, but Riley isn’t sure when that transition will take place.

“We’ll see when this assignment is over,” he said. “In a way, we negotiate the next assignment, and if it’s something I like, something I want to do ... we’ll see. When this assignment is over, Logan will be graduating from high school, Mason will be a sophomore and Grace will be getting close to high school. We’ll see what’s best for our family.”

And family is important to Capt. John Riley.

His parents and extended family expected hard work when he was growing up. While competing in football, track and baseball, he often had two jobs. That’s just what a Riley did, and he’s grateful for that.

“That Midwestern work ethic,” he said, “has taken me a long ways in the Navy. I had great role models — not just my family but teachers, coaches and everyone else in New Hampton — and like I said, without all those people to lead the way for me, my life would have been far different.”

Write-in votes will determine two City Council winners

Incumbent Joe Denner ran unopposed for the at-large position, but both Ward 1 and Ward 3 did not have any candidates on the ballot.

The Chickasaw County Auditor’s Office reported that 80 write-in votes were cast in Ward 1 and another 68 write-in votes were made in Ward 3, but the office went through those votes on Wednesday after this edition of the New Hampton Tribune

went to press.

Ward 1 Councilman Cory McDonald did not seek re-election, but former Mayor Deb Larsen announced in October that she was seeking the seat that represents the city’s northeast quadrant as a write-in candidate.

In Ward 3, which includes the city’s southwest quadrant, Councilman Jason Speltz did not file nomination papers but in recent weeks, he asked the residents he currently represents to cast write-in votes for him.

New Hampton’s School Board races, meanwhile, lacked any drama as incumbents Jay Matthews and Nate Schwickerath ran unopposed.

And New Hampton’s Park Board also had an uncontested race as both Brian Moore and Megan Abbas ran unopposed for the two open four-year terms.

Tuesday’s votes won’t be official until the Chickasaw County Board of Supervisors canvass the election, which is expected to take place next week.

Salvation Army to begin Red Kettle campaign, needs bell ringers

The Chickasaw County unit of the Salvation Army will begin its annual Red Kettle campaign on Wednesday, Nov. 15, and bell ringers are needed for the fundraising drive that runs through Christmas Eve.

The kettle will once again be at Fareway from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m., and those who want to volunteer to ring the bell can do so by calling Lros Markham at 641-229-0113.

Funds raised during the campaign are used to help county residents navigate emergencies and tragedies, and Markham said that “the more volunteers we have, the more we can help people.”

Public works director makes plea for surveys to be completed

The EPA recently revised the Lead-Copper Rule and is requiring citywide inventories across the country to be completed for lead service lines by Oct. 16, 2024.

A water service line is the connection between the water distribution pipe (water main in the street or right-of-way) and the water meter in your home or business. If lead service lines are discovered, you may be eligible to receive funding to have those lines replaced.

If you have already completed the survey for your property, just disregard. This is mandatory for the city of New Hampton to complete.

As of to-date, according to Public Works Director Casey Maik only 659 properties out of 1,679 (39.24%) have completed the survey. Please go to the link at <https://arcg.is/KHKHz> or go to the city of New Hampton’s website (newhamptonia.com) and complete the short survey.

Failure to submit will result in a fine and City Staff having to enter your structure at a later date to verify. Please fill out a separate survey for each property you own within the City of New Hampton. There are hard copies of the survey, available for pick-up at City Hall if you don’t have the electronic means to complete.

What Should You Know About RMDs?

You may spend decades contributing to various retirement accounts. But for some accounts, such as a traditional IRA and 401(k), you must start withdrawing funds at a certain point. What should you know about this requirement?

To begin with, the rules governing these withdrawals — technically called required minimum distributions, or RMDs — have changed recently. For many years, individuals had to begin taking their RMDs (which are based on the account balance and the IRS' life expectancy factor) when they turned 70½. The original SECURE Act of 2019 raised this age to 72, and SECURE 2.0, passed in 2022, raised it again, to 73. (If you turned 73 in 2023, and you were 72 in 2022 when the RMD limit was still 72, you should have taken your first RMD for 2022 by April 1 of this year. You will then need to take your 2023 RMD by Dec. 31. And going forward, you'll also need to take your RMDs by the end of every year.)

Not all retirement accounts are subject to RMDs. They aren't required for a Roth IRA, and, starting in 2024, won't be required for a Roth 401(k) or 403(b) plan. But if your account does call for RMDs, you do need to take them, because if you don't, you could face tax penalties. Previously, this penalty was 50% of the amount you were supposed to have taken, but SECURE 2.0 reduced it to 25%.

When you take your RMDs, you need to be aware of a key issue: taxes. RMDs are taxed as ordinary income, and, as such, they could potentially bump you into a higher tax bracket and possibly even increase your Medicare premiums, which are determined by your modified adjusted gross income. Are there any ways you could possibly reduce an RMD-related tax hike?

You might have some options. Here are two to consider:

- Convert tax-deferred accounts to Roth IRA. You could convert some, or maybe all, of your tax-deferred retirement accounts to a Roth IRA. By doing so, you could lower your RMDs in the future — while adding funds to an account you're never required to touch. So, if you don't really need all the money to live on, you could include the remainder of the Roth IRA in your estate plans, providing an initially tax-free inheritance to your loved ones. However, converting a tax-deferred account to a Roth IRA will generate taxes in the year of conversion, so you'd need the money available to pay this tax bill.
- Donate RMDs to charity. In what's known as a qualified charitable distribution, you can move up to \$100,000 of your RMDs directly from a traditional IRA to a qualified charity, avoiding the taxes that might otherwise result if you took the RMDs yourself. After 2023, the \$100,000 limit will be indexed to inflation.

Of course, before you start either a Roth IRA conversion or a qualified charitable distribution, you will need to consult with your tax advisor, as both these moves have issues you must consider and may not be appropriate for your situation.

But it's always a good idea to know as much as you can about the various aspects of RMDs — they could play a big part in your retirement income strategy.

City Council stays the course, wants county to pay for bigger pipe

cool response from Chris."

Kehoe had already told Clemens and Schwickerath that he would drop the rate for the containers from \$15.09 a month to \$13.99 a month, and he said he would still honor that offer.

Clemens told council members that it would cost the city about \$20,000 a month if it picked up those costs, and she pointed out that there is about \$81,000 currently in the Solid Waste Fund. She told the council she would recommend that the city pay for the first two months of bins.

"I like that recommendation of two months, just through the holidays," Councilman Cory McDonald said. "Like you said, not deplete, so if something else comes up, there's a cushion that the city has should there be a need just as important or greater."

His fellow council members agreed and approved Clemens' recommendation.

Currently, residents pay for their garbage pickup by purchasing yellow bags. The larger size bags are five for \$8.65 while the smaller size are five for \$5.55. Thus, residents who put out two larger size bags a week pay about \$14.98 a month in garbage fees, but for those residents who put out just one smaller size bag a week, fees are around \$4.81 a month.

"It is disappointing because I think Jendro and the city were really on to something when it came to the discount," Councilwoman Mindy Humpal said. "I think from being at the meeting, you know the city really went to bat for its residents. I know people aren't going to be happy, but we'll move forward and make this work."

Also on Monday, the City Council turned down a request from Chickasaw County Board of Supervisors Chairman Matt Kuhn to have the city pay a small part of the price tag to extend city water services to the Heritage Center, a county-owned building located just south of the city limits.

The county had agreed to pay for the project but balked when the city said it would only do so if an eight-inch water main was installed instead of a six-inch line. That bigger pipe added almost \$16,000 to the \$213,000 cost of bringing city water to the Heritage.

Supervisors have said they felt it was unfair that the county pay for the project because, as Scott Cerwinski put it at a recent meeting, "we get no benefit from having an eight-inch line; only the city benefits."

City Councilman Joe Denner at first expressed interest in having the city pickup the additional cost for a larger main, saying "when you're doing infrastructure, the bigger, the better" — pointing out that if there is growth to the south of New Hampton, a larger pipe would be beneficial for the city.

McDonald, though, said he couldn't support the city paying the extra money, and the rest of the council agreed — putting the project in limbo.

the city. They're getting a really good deal on that."

The third phase will extend the trail from its current end on South Linn Avenue to the Character Counts Trail that begins near the Chickasaw Wellness Complex and runs through the west-side Industrial Park.

Longtime TRIBE Trail Committee member Megan Baltes said that the lower-than-expected bid means there will be some funds left over, which means "we will have a contingency remaining."

New Hampton Parks and Recreation Director Tara Perkins said that Wicks officials have said they will begin construction in the spring of 2024 and should wrap up the trail by the end of summer.

In early 2022, the City Council approved using \$200,000 of New Hampton's American Rescue Plan Act funds to help jumpstart fundraising on the final phase of the trail. The first phase of the trail, which ran from Mikkelson Park

to Garnant Park and ended at Logan Street was completed in 2017. The second phase, which ran from Logan Street to the south and then cut to the west to Linn Avenue, was finished in 2019.

When COVID-19 hit in 2020, TRIBE Trail Committee members put fundraising on hold, but thanks to an anonymous donation that was contingent on the city committing ARPA funds to the project, fundraising took off last year.

"We're extremely grateful for the donations we received and obviously the grants we've been awarded," Baltes said, "and it's really nice to know that a year from now, the entire trail will be completed. It offers a lot to our city and we're excited to get it finished."

team last year as a freshman that won a championship in prop dancing for the second-consecutive season – was also part of a group that were pioneers in a sense.

The state will hold its 48th annual state team and solo competitions at Wells Fargo Arena and Hy-Vee Hall from November 29-December 1. But this is the first year that solo dancers have had to qualify. There is still no qualifying round for teams that compete at state.

That meant the pressure was on for Kylee to advance from the regional round – which took place on Saturday, Oct. 28 at Newton Berg Middle School.

She passed with flying colors as she met the state criteria of a top-10 finish at the qualifier and vaulted herself into state. She'll also look to snare a fourth team state title in a row for New Hampton. New Hampton first won a state team title back in 2020 in the hip-hop category.

What does it take to be the best at a sport that involves a lot of dedication and devotion?

Support, for one thing. That's where Kylee's mom comes in. Amber said once Kylee was all in to compete at dance, she would be too. "I always said as long as she was committed, I would be committed," said Amber Junk.

The beginnings of Kylee's athletic career started with tumbling at around the age of three years of age. She actually incorporates elements and aspects of that sport into her routines – which she described as contemporary, with an artistic and emotional element to

her choreography and dance composition.

"It's like a big mix," said Kylee. Schwickerath said contemporary dance routines are a new style and weren't even around 10 years ago.

But it was Schwickerath – who literally and figuratively opened the door for Amber and Kylee – that helped pave the way for the newly-christened state soloist to march toward another possible state championship.

In order to achieve that dream – tumbling kind of took a back seat

to dance.

Amber said she'd drive Kylee to Waterloo to practice tumbling – often times that would entail four-hour long workouts away from home.

"Emma's like a godsend for opening up because it was a lot," said Amber.

Kylee practices dance right around when the sun first starts to come up out of the horizon at six in the morning. Then she goes off to school and comes back to the studio at night to teach kids and also has studio classes until about 8:15 p.m.

It's that work ethic to get better that has really impressed Schwickerath.

"Kylee is one of the hardest working kids I've ever coached. She's constantly in the studio," said Schwickerath. "This kid works really hard and she puts in a lot of hours. When she's not dancing, she's athletically training and working out. We're proud of her. She worked her butt off."

There were 73 dancers in Kylee's solo Class V division at the qualifier. That's where she also caught up with a friend she's gained from the

sport – sophomore Abby Pausley from Okoboji. Pausley also qualified for the state solo competition.

The two met when they were auditioning for the All-Iowa team and were competing right next to each other in a kick routine.

"That's kind of like a friendship that's grown, too, this year at a few events," said Kylee.

Olivia Horner and Emma Carpenter also competed at Newton at the qualifier. Horner earned a Div. I rating and Carpenter came up with a Div. II rating.

Schwickerath said the state has made the scoring more stringent in order to achieve a Div. I rating. The criteria used to be dancers had to come up with a score of 75 points out of 100. Now that threshold has been bumped up to 80.

Junk, Carpenter, Horner and Madison Shawver were selected to the All-Iowa team – which will perform at the Iowa prep girls state basketball tournament in March. Schwickerath said roughly 500 kids auditioned with about 270 that made the prestigious team.

Schwickerath stated Iowa has the largest state dance competition in the nation. She also said Florida and Texas' state meets are big as well.

Schwickerath said New Hampton has had a dance team for 40 years. Her goal is obviously to take her squads to even greater heights than they've already reached.

"We are diligently trying to get dance more recognized as a sport," said Schwickerath. "I think New Hampton is getting better. It's something we've really had to work hard for."

Heideman gained in the early 1990s. McShane also finished his career with 53 touchdowns to eclipse Heideman's career mark of 51.

The senior was also a standout on defense, making 36 tackles and leading the Chickasaws with 7.5 tackles for loss. He also recovered a pair of fumbles.

Leading the way up front for McShane was McCumber, who had a strong year on both sides. Along with his linemates — Zeien, Josephson, Reicks and Caleb Rochford — McCumber was a big reason New Hampton's running game came on strong late in the season, and he also finished with 23.5 tackles while playing end on the defensive line.

Laures caught 10 passes for 215 yards and three touchdowns and also was an excellent blocker as a tight end. The senior also had 26.5 tackles and an interception as a safety.


Ewert was second on the team in receptions with 13, and he was the lone player in Class 2A, District 3 who returned both a punt and a kickoff for touchdowns during 2023.

Zeien, meanwhile, made the move from tackle to center on offense and like Josephson was a three-year starter up front for New Hampton. Josephson also finished with 16.5 tackles while Zeien had 8.5. Josephson was also one of three Chickasaws to come up with an interception and he was the lone one to take it to the "house" as he scored on a 34-yard return in a game against Crestwood.

New Hampton's defensive selections were hard-nosed players who came into their own this past season. Robinson, who missed much of the 2022 season with a broken leg, led New Hampton with 36.5 tackles and also made two fumble recoveries. Bohaty finished with





33 tackles while Swehla came up with 28.5 tackles, including 4.5 for losses. Swehla also had a strong year on the offensive side of the ball, especially as a lead blocker for McShane.

New Hampton's two second-team selections also gave the Chickasaws solid efforts on both sides of the ball. Gilbert completed 39 of 91 passes for 599 yards and five touchdowns, and the senior cornerback made 21.5 tackles. Eckley was New Hampton's second leading rusher with 283 yards on 75 carries while making 25 tackles and also was second on the team with 6.5 tackles for loss.

New Hampton's honorable mention selections included two lineman on opposite sides of the ball. Reicks was a tough-nosed, albeit smallish, guard on the line while Shekleton finished with 13.5 tackles, five for losses, and recovered a team-high three fumbles.

The Chickasaws' 13 all-district players were key in turning around a season that got off to a dismal start. New Hampton went winless and was outscored 173-52 during its first four games of the season, but righted the

Chickasaws place baker's dozen on all-district

McShane, McCumber pick up MVP awards; New Hampton has 11 seniors cap careers with recognition from district coaches

New Hampton football coach Scott Frerichs watched his seniors make tremendous strides — both on and off the field — over the past three seasons, which is one reason he was happy to let them know they were ending their prep careers with all-district honors. "These guys have come a long way since they first came up to the varsity," the veteran coach said. "They've grown a lot as football players and as individuals. They've made some really good contributions to our team, and the program will miss them."

After a season in which it went 4-6 but missed a district title by just one point and picked up its first playoff win since 2017, New Hampton had 13 players, including 11 seniors, receive all-district honors.

The Chickasaws postseason recognition was led by two Class 2A, District 3 most valuable players as Braden McShane was named the district's offensive MVP and Gatlin McCumber was tabbed as the offensive lineman MVP.

New Hampton was also represented on the first team by linemen Marshall Zeien

and Kam Josephson, receiver Cael Laures, return specialist Adam Ewert, defensive lineman Ethan Swehla, linebacker Ty Robinson and defensive back Talyn Bohaty. The Chickasaws' Ben Gilbert and Jaxon Eckley were named to the second team while Leander Reicks and Ty Shekleton were tabbed as honorable mention.

"We were one point away from being district champions," Frerichs said, "so I think all these kids deserve the recognition they received. I'm happy for all of them."

And almost all of them are seniors; in fact, the only two underclassmen to receive all-district honors were Ewert and Eckley, who are both juniors.

McShane was the obvious offensive MVP in a year in which the senior battled a hamstring injury that forced him to miss 3 1/2 games on the offensive side of the ball. Still, he led the district in overall rushing yards with 995 and in district rushing yards, picking up 573. He finished his standout career with 3,976 yards to become New Hampton's all-time leading rusher, breaking the mark of 3,775 that Curt

A DANCE FOR HISTORY!

KYLEE JUNK BECOMES FIRST NEW HAMPTON DANCER TO INDIVIDUALLY QUALIFY FOR STATE

Emma Schwickerath vividly remembers Kylee Junk and her mother showing up at her brand new brick and mortar dance studio six years ago.

The prospective dancer — then about nine years old — wanted to give dancing a try after competing in gymnastics for several years.

The problem was Kylee and her mom Amber missed the registration deadline to begin to start taking lessons in a sport where athletes express a range of emotions through body movement.

No worries, though, as Schwickerath welcomed them with open arms and the rest is well, history in the making.

That was the fall of 2017 when Miss Emma's Dance Company opened its doors to the youth of New Hampton.

"She's one of the originals," said Schwickerath, a 2013 New Hampton High School grad, about Kylee's involvement with her dance team.

Now Kylee — a sophomore at New Hampton School — stands alone as the first ever solo dancer from New Hampton to qualify and eventually compete at the ISDTA (Iowa State Dance & Drill Team Association) state meet.

That's later this month in downtown Des Moines.

But first one must realize and recognize the effort and long hours that Kylee — and

her mom — logged in order to become one of the state's best for a dance program that has also risen to the top in a relative short amount of time.

"I know Kylee's a huge inspiration to these younger kids," said Schwickerath.

"She teaches here at the studio and is working with a lot of our kids and putting that fire into them as well. They love watching Kylee dance. They love watching the big kids dance, they just think it's so cool."

Schwickerath talked about that very first day when Kylee's dance career first got off the ground.

"She registered late — even. I cut off registration and they showed up like a week later," said Schwickerath. "And I was like, 'yeah, sure, come on in and we'll take you.'"

Needless to say, Kylee took to dance like a duck takes to water.

"After the first week of class, Kylee came in and was like, 'I want to work on turns. I want to work on turns.' You were just constantly every week coming in and you had worked on stuff already on your own and you'd come in and showed me all the stuff you'd work on. That's how she still is now. She'll show up to practice and be like, 'look what I can do.'"

Yet, as impactful as I find those photos year after year, there is one that stands out above the rest, and on the day before Veterans Day 2023, I will get that opportunity to shoot the photo that for some reason means the most to me.

I'll be in the old gymnasium at Nashua-Plainfield High School, and I will shoot dozens — no, scores — of photos of the entire high school student body lining up to say thank you to the community's veterans.

It. Gets. To. Me. Every. Single. Time. For a few minutes, kids ages 14 to 18 make their way past each veteran, shake his or her hand and express the gratitude of a grateful nation. What makes it so impactful to me is that many of the students stop and talk for a minute or two, and when I see the smiles on the faces of both the students and the veterans, it just warms my heart.

Veterans Day always falls on Nov. 11, which means it takes place during the month of Thanksgiving, and although I realize that the date for Veterans Day came from the day World War I ended in 1918, I

think it's fitting that in a month where we set aside a day for thanksgiving, we celebrate the men and women who have served our nation in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines and Coast Guard.

And we should be thankful.

Look, I grew up in a home where we took Veterans Day seriously; after all, my father served our country in the Air Force for 20-plus years.

During that time, he saw the world. Dad's postings literally spanned the globe. He was stationed in places like England, Germany, Japan, Turkey, South Korea and Vietnam. In America, his postings took him to Texas, California, South Dakota and Alaska. He made lifetime friends — both with his fellow airmen and the residents of the states and countries where he served.

But Melroy W. Fenske, like every veteran listed in this special section, also sacrificed a lot. He went years without seeing his parents. He was gone for birthdays and other celebrations. When he was home, he packed a lot into a tiny bit of time.

Dad served from 1951 to 1972 — long before the advent of cell phones and the internet — and when he passed away in 2004, I found a box of letters that he had

received and sent during his long military career.

I read Grandma's letters updating him on how his little sister, Caroline, was doing in school and how Grandpa was showing off his multi-tasking skills.

"I'm writing this on a Sunday afternoon. Your dad and I went to church this morning, but I hope this makes sense because it's crazy loud in here," Grandma wrote in one letter she sent my dad in September 1964. "That darn TV was the worst thing we ever got because dad is listening to the Twins game on one radio, the news on the other radio and watching the Vikings on the tube. And he has all three turned way up. Good heavens, I hope it's more peaceful where you're at."

Both my mom and grandma also saved letters dad had written to them, and over the years, he added them to his box. I found one that he had written mom while he was in Vietnam in 1967, when he wrote about how much he missed his wife and his kids.

"I know I get extra pay being over here, but I'd give it all back to see you, Cathy and Bobby just for a few minutes," he wrote. "I hope they're behaving for you. Hopefully,

they take after you and not me, because if they're like me, Ma always told me I was the mischievous one out of the bunch."

A few paragraphs later, he wrote about Saigon and the people he had met.

"You know, when I was growing up back in Gibbon, I never thought I'd ever even get out of Minnesota, and here I am, in the middle of a city and a country that seems like it's all jungle. The South Viets are nice people, but in the back of your mind, you're always thinking are they VC and waiting for their chance to take you out. But don't worry, I'll be fine and I will see you soon."

Soon was a relative term, for Dad wrote that letter in August and wouldn't make it back to Rapid City until February.

Yet, as proud as he was to be a veteran, Dad always thought Veterans Day was for the other guys — as he put it, "the ones who really went to hell and back."

I think that's why those pictures of kids expressing their gratitude to veterans mean so much to me, because every veteran — my Dad, the ones who went to hell and back and the ones who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country — deserves a thank you.



A VETERANS DAY FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

TEN YEARS AGO, VETERANS AND RESIDENTS CAME TOGETHER TO DEDICATE THE BEAUTIFUL AND MEANINGFUL CHICKASAW COUNTY VETERANS MEMORIAL

Virtually every day, Mick Gage's route from his home near Mikkelson Park to work at Mick Gage Plumbing and Heating takes him by the Chickasaw County Veterans Memorial that is located on the courthouse square in New Hampton.

And virtually every day, he can't help but smile about the warm thoughts he has of that cold, snowy day 10 years ago.

"It still means a lot to me to see it," he said, "and I don't think that will ever go away. So many people came together to make that memorial happen, and I still get shivers when I think of that day. Sometimes, it seems like yesterday, and

honestly, it's hard to believe it's been 10 years."

There may never be another Veterans Day like that one, because everything — including the snow that had fallen overnight — was dang near perfect on Monday, Nov. 11, 2013.

A county-wide veterans memorial had

been talked about for years, but a committee — led by Gage and Joe Glaser — formed in early 2012 finally got the ball rolling. First up was raising \$350,000, a number that some cynics said was simply unreachable.

If there is a lesson in this tale, it is this: Don't tell folks like Gage, Glaser and their

fellow committee members that something is impossible, for that word is simply not in their vocabulary. In a year's time, they had raised the money — all from private sources — and work began on the memorial.

"We had a great committee," Gage said, "and Joe and I were just lucky enough to be the leaders. That group of people made a decision that this was going to get done, and by God, they got it done."

As the stones went up, they were wrapped. These presents were going to be opened on Veterans Day.

the ground — when Monday, Nov. 11, 2013, dawned. Overnight, temperatures had dropped into the mid-teens and a couple of inches of snow — the first of the season — had fallen, but in many ways, the snow added to the beauty of the scene. The contrast between the white snow and the black granite and the cobblestones was simply stunning.

"It's really one of the most beautiful scenes I've taken pictures of in my career," longtime New Hampton Tribune and Nashua Reporter employee Dorothy Huber said. "I mean it was cold, don't get me wrong, but it was worth it."

And people came from all over the county. That 2013 observance was easily the largest gathering of folks to attend a Veterans Day program in years, if not the entire history of the county.

Back in 2013, the Tribune usually went to press at 11 a.m. on Monday mornings, but Dave Stanley, the owner and publisher of the newspaper, told the printer that "we're going to be late." Stanley had backed the memorial by donating almost \$5,000 from the newspaper's 2012 and 2013 Veterans Day special section proceeds to the project.

He wanted it in the paper that came out the next day and told the writer of this story to make it happen. He covered the event from the ground while Huber provided aerial shots, thanks to a boom truck provided by the New Hampton Municipal Light Plant.

"One of the things I'll always remember is this young woman helping a veteran — her dad or grandpa — to his seat," Huber said, "and they were walking under the arch and I just think that picture really captured what the day was all about."

MEMBERS OF EVERY veterans post in the county took part in the program, and for the members of the

committee that was vitally important. "We didn't want this to be just a New Hampton thing," Gage said. "Our towns have wonderful memorials, but we didn't have one that celebrated the veterans of all of Chickasaw County. To see all the posts there — I can still see them all there — was just wonderful."

The program included the invocation and benediction by Father Ken Glaser, Joe Glaser's son. Matthew Gage, Mick Gage's son, returned home to talk about the Eagle Scout Memorial he had built in 1989 that had been incorporated into the new memorial.

Harry Kerr, an Army veteran who served in both Vietnam and the Middle East, delivered a keynote address centered around the "cost of service" and reminded those in attendance to remember those who were still serving in America's armed forces.

"Today is about remembering who has gone before and who is serving today," said Kerr, who at the time was a college professor in Minnesota. "There are soldiers, sailors, airmen and Marines who are in harm's way."

Powerful words, yes, but the big moment came after Kerr spoke, when veterans spread out and removed the plastic from the archway and the granite stones that contained the names of 1,122 Chickasaw veterans and active military personnel.


Ten years later, Huber remembers that moment as if it was yesterday.

"I had goosebumps, and not just because it was cold," she said. "I've covered a lot of things at the paper over the years, but that ceremony is one that really stands out. It was just a wonderful day."

WHEN THE VETERANS Day observance ended, hundreds of residents made their way to the stones to find the names of their loved ones.

They found their dads, their grandfathers, their uncles, their sisters and more, and many fought a battle with their emotions. John Tiemessen, an attorney from Fairbanks, Alaska, was in New Hampton to honor his father, who grew up in the North Washington area, served during World War II and then moved to Alaska.

"This place is what made dad who he was," the attorney said, "and to be a part of



this day ... we'll never forget it."

Joe Glaser agreed.

"To be here today, to see all the people here, it's just really special," he said on that magical day 10 years ago. "I don't care about the snow or cold, it's a warm day in my eyes."

MUCH HAS CHANGED in 10 years — both here in Chickasaw County and the world, but the memorial continues to be a "must-see" for those traveling to the county's largest city.

The memorial received a major edition in 2015, when sculptor Scott Nelson and the Chickasaw County Veterans Memorial Committee unveiled a piece of art depicting a mother and child receiving the flag that covered the casket of a husband and father.

Names continued to be added to the memorial; in fact, there are now more than 1,300 on the 12 stones. And the additions will continue.

Bonnie Gage, Mick Gage's wife, said that those who are interested in having their names added can do so by filling out an application that includes a copy of a veteran's DD214 form and pay \$150.

"We've had years when the folks from

Lewiston [Minnesota] will come to put 20 names on it, some years, it might be three," Bonnie Gage said, "but it's something that will keep happening for years to come. That was something that we really wanted when we came up with the memorial idea, to keep adding those that would serve after it was built."

And the memorial has been home to New Hampton's Veterans Day and Memorial Day observances ever since that cold, snowy day 10 years ago. It has also provided the backdrop for numerous Quilts of Valor presentations over the years.

"It's really a beautiful memorial," said

Brian Quirk, the longtime commander of New Hampton's American Legion post, Fae Stine Post 138. "I think it adds to our observances, and we're grateful for all the people who put their time and effort and money into it."

So is Mick Gage, who will continue to drive to and from work via Prospect Street.

"I almost always think about the day we dedicated it," he said, "and the people who made it possible. We had big donations, small donations and everything in between. That memorial shows you what can happen when people work together for a common cause."

Rotary Club excited to offer flag ‘subscription’ program

Service organization will put out and take down flags on five holidays for city residents

For those who would like to get a little patriotic on the five “biggie” red-white-and-blue holidays, the New Hampton Rotary Club may have just the ticket — a flag subscription program.

Basically, it works like this: For 50 bucks a year, the club will install a “base” for a 7-foot flag pole and make sure Old Glory is flying on Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day, Labor Day and Veterans Day.

“It’s a really cool program, and it’s beautiful to see a neighborhood with all the flags flying on a holiday,” Rotary Club President Carrie Becker said.

And she ought to know. She lives in Charles City, where the local Lions Club has offered a flag subscription program for a number of years.

“They deliver the flags and the poles and pick them up,” she said, “and that’s exactly what we’re going to do with our program. The best part of it is the base is always there, and it’s sunk in the ground enough that, even when you’re mowing, you just go right over it. Heck, you don’t even know it’s there until it’s a holiday and you have a flag flying.”

Longtime Rotary member Jennifer Monteith said club member Erin McGee made the suggestion at a recent meeting, and almost immediately, Rotary

decided to embrace the project as a fundraiser.

The program will only be offered within the city limits, and both Becker and Monteith said that the club may partner with groups like the Boy Scouts, the Interact Club or even high school seniors who want to earn “service hours” for scholarships.

Proceeds from the flag subscription program will be used to sponsor projects and youth programming, and will also benefit the club’s scholarship program.

“If this takes off, we’re going to definitely need the help,” Monteith said, “but we all thought this would be a great way to raise some funds and also really brighten the community on holidays.”

The program will begin with Memorial Day in 2024, and Becker said the hope is that the initial workload will be heavy.

“But once we get the bases in, it’s really just about putting the flags up, picking them up and getting them in storage,” she said. “We think it’s a win-win. For us, it raises some much-needed funds so we can support the causes we care about and for the community, it’s just a really nice way to present New Hampton not just to our visitors but also to our neighbors.”

Club members are also hoping that the flag subscription program will be a great gift idea for that hard-to-buy-for relative, and it’s

She signed up for three years and is still active 17 years later

Waucoma woman wanted adventure, but found life partner along the way

It wasn't Lisa Roach's intention to make a career out of the service when she joined the Air Force after college, but after serving several two-year stretches here, a couple three-stints year there and a four-year term thrown in, she now finds herself on track for retirement in 2026. And she wouldn't change a thing about her time in the service.

The 2002 Turkey Valley graduate wanted adventure, to travel and see different cultures — which she did — but she also found a life partner along the way to share all those interests.

Growing up on a farm west of Waucoma, Lisa Scallan, along with siblings Kayla and Jeff, helped parents Frank and Therese Scallan with the long list of chores necessary to run a dairy and crop farming operation. She credits some of her success in the service to the early work ethic developed on that farm.

"Absolutely, I kind of prided myself on that," she said. "I established the work ethic early that I still employ to this day."

Now a Lt. Col., Roach joined the Air Force after completing four years at Iowa State University, where she obtained a degree in Agricultural Engineering.

"I've always been patriotic, but even more so after 9-11, I just felt a calling, and the job sounded unique, an opportunity to travel, to learn new skills."

So she signed up for three years, and her first job was at Offutt Air Force base in Omaha as a Bioenvironmental Engineer.

"I was responsible for preventive health of everybody on base. The industrial shop, for example, you identify, assess, and control hazards like chemicals, noise and radiation." She was HAZMAT operations qualified, to be able to go into a hazardous zone and advise what to do, and even though there were no major emergencies, she said they were always training for that scenario.

Going into the service after college, Roach signed up as an officer, so basic training might have been a little easier. "You see movies where they're yelling at you all the time.... it wasn't like that. I mean, I worked to make sure I could pass the physical fitness test, but the training wasn't life-changing."

When her three years was up, Roach signed on for two more years. "As officers, you have a little more flexibility so I was just able to do two more years."

Toward the end of Omaha, she deployed to Southwest Asia as an executive officer. "I was the support to the Commander, who was responsible for the security, communication, civil engineering and logistics on the base. I wanted the opportunity to do something else, but I worked really hard over there!"

Then came another two-year extension, where Lisa spent a year in South Korea, at Kunsan Air Base. She went hiking and



touring there, including a visit to the DMZ.

"Experiencing a new culture was pretty interesting, but the highlight was meeting Dan," she said of her husband-to-be, who was stationed at the same air base. "It was nice that we were able to do some of that stuff together."

That was the only time in her years of service Roach lived on-base. "We had a close-knit community, we had a lot of close friends."

In order to serve a year in Korea, Roach had to serve a year elsewhere. She went to Fort Collins, Colorado, where she obtained her master's degree in Health Physics, explaining that as "radiation health and safety for people and the environment."

As the service paid for that degree, Roach owed them three more years. After marrying Dan, the couple went to Dayton Ohio, to Wright-Patterson AFB. There she taught bioenvironmental engineers.

"I loved it, absolutely loved it, probably one of my favorite jobs so far," she admitted. "All the students wanted to be there and we have a really good team creating the program, trying to do things better and more efficiently."

Dan no longer was in the service and transitioned into work life with his degree in business administration with an emphasis on finance.

The next move took them to Rapid City, South Dakota, where they fell in love all over again - with rock climbing in the Black Hills.

"We loved that assignment, we started climbing in the gym and we went every weekend. We never had any bad falls, it can be done safely as long as you know what you're doing. But it's exhilarating and

a great feeling of strength and accomplishment!"

Work at the Ellsworth AFB there included planning the area to house the new B-21 bomber.

"They were still in the planning stage, things like planning the ventilation system, basically to design the area to protect the people that worked there."

She also deployed to Qatar six months while at South Dakota.

When the next assignment was to Washington D.C., the couple again took advantage of the surroundings. "We loved all the history, the Library of Congress, we observed a Supreme Court hearing, all the museums, we ran on the National Mall and I played on the softball team there."

Lisa also took a group of high school friends on a tour of the Pentagon. "That's not my regular place of work, but I had access to it."

The work in D.C. was more radiation-focused, managing radioactive material. "We permitted everybody and it was a fair amount of travel, I'd fly out to different bases and make sure they were in compliance."

In 2021 her promotion to Lt. Col. came up. She talks about that accomplishment much the same as making the peak of a big climb - rewarding.

"It was very humble and rewarding," she said of her promotion. "It took a lot of hard work and significant support from everyone around me."

Now the 39-year old finds herself back in Omaha. "I'm happy to come back full circle, and this assignment is something pretty different."

She is the Squadron Commander for

the 55th Medical Support Squadron at Offutt Air Force base. "I work inside the clinic and am responsible for eight diverse sections within the clinic." The clinic, with a 30 million dollar budget, takes about 50 or more hours a week of Roach's time on average. "I have 170 people in my squadron and there are 43 thousand people that can use our services to include the Pharmacy. Obviously I have other people managing the budget in the individual areas but I have to make sure they're accountable and that we're providing safe care."

Still a youngster, Roach still finds moving more of a challenge as time goes by. "It's hard, you establish roots and make friends but then you have to leave them. Without the support of Dan and family it would be extremely challenging. I really appreciate them."

In 2026 Lisa will hit 20 years in the service. Then what?

"We'll have some big decisions to make. I hope to go back to radiation-focused work."

Most options — including staying in the service — are open. The only option probably not on the table, again because of that work ethic, is retiring completely.

For anyone interested in going into the service, Roach offers some advice.

"Be selective in the job they're going to take. Some people take the first job that comes along but there are jobs that translate very well into civilian life and some that don't. Know what skills you want to cultivate. Know what your options are."

But it's a great opportunity," she concluded. "To get out there and see what's beyond Northeast Iowa.... but I will always consider Waucoma my home."


