## Hinson covers plenty of ground

Congresswoman chides Democrats for overspending, overreaching, over regulating

U.S. Rep. Ashley Hinson, the woman who represents Chickasaw County in Washington, covered a lot of ground Monday during the town hall meeting she held in New Hampton.

She went after China, Democrats who she said must believe there is a "money tree in the basement of the

Capitol" and what she called the "fourth branch," i.e. the federal bureaucracy, of the federal government.

But the Republican who represents Iowa's Second Congressional District also, at times,



sounded a moderate tone during the hour-long meeting at the Chickasaw Event Center.

Early in the meeting, Hinson said there is a reason the GOP was able to win back control of the House in 2022.

"People are tired of the overspending, overreaching and over regulatory attitude of Washington," said Hinson, who added that "Washington needs to be run more

like Iowa."

She decried the power federal bureaucrats have gained in recent years because of executive orders issued by presidents of both parties.

"I'll admit it's both parties, and it simply must stop," she said. "We in effect have an unregulated fourth branch

Woodbridge Street was blocked off near downtown Nashua Wednesday evening — and for good reason.


The Nashua Public Library, along with Absolute Science, threw a block party just west of Main Street.

## It's a 'foamtastic' time at the library

Heather Hackman said over 200 people attended the fun-filled event. Kids ate hot dogs and received a free book prior to the foam that made its way to the pavement and overtook the street just south of the library. A giant foam cannon dispensed the white, soapy substance that kids played around in and marveled at.

"It won't hurt grass, it won't flowers. I wouldn't want to eat it because there is a little bit of soap in it just to give it the foamy texture," said Toto Johnson. "It's about as mild as mild gets."

Johnson, a former circus clown with Ringling Brothers, was Absolute Science's featured "entertainer."

He guided the cannon that sprayed the foam, which built up quickly and created essentially a wall of the sudsy stuff, much like a washing machine does when too much detergent is poured into it.

The foam is biodegradable and FDA approved, Johnson added.

"Foam like this has been around for quite awhile — like at nightclubs and parties and discos and things like that," said Johnson.

Johnson said Absolute Science travels to nine states — all of the bordering states that surround Iowa. This is a full-time job for Johnson at Absolute Science — which he said is the No.1 foam-producing company in the world. He said it took five years to develop this particular type of foam.

Johnson said he took his foam cannon on Tuesday evening to Monticello and that morning he hosted a bubble show in Ames. On Monday, Johnson was in Yankton, South Dakota. He said Thursday he'll travel to Ogden, Iowa and end up the evening at the Woodbury County Fair in



Moville, Iowa.

Absolute Science brings an exciting brand of interaction with the audience and their science staff, who help motivate youth to learn more according to their website.

In addition to traveling to libraries all across the heartland, Absolute Science also performs at schools, birthday parties, corporate and public events.

Johnson said the company has grown quite a bit since its formation seven years ago. Absolute Science started with one science show and now has five. They also put on two bubbles show and offer a butterfly encounter as well.

During the summer months — obviously the company's busiest time of the year — Johnson said five Absolute Science entertainers are working seven days a week at various locations throughout the Midwest.

Hackman said the library was fortunate enough to receive two grants for its summer reading program — "Theisen's More for Your Community" corporate grant and the CPPC (Community Partnerships for Protecting Children) grant.

"I knew that I wanted to give each participant an experience they normally wouldn't have through our programs and what better way than promoting reading in the process," Hackman said.

"So that is why I thought outside the box and came up with these last four weeks of programs that are an experience that families can participate in together."

The theme this summer for all libraries in the state of Iowa is "Find Your Voice."

The library started out its summer reading program with "Find Your Voice with Ariel." Ariel, from the "Little Mermaid," sang for the 100 who attended the magical event. Ariel also read one of her favorite stories, shared in the fun as kids did crafts and took pictures with those that came to the program.

The next week, the library hosted an art program, which saw cartoonist, illustrator and author — Tim Read — entertain folks. The following week an instrument petting zoo took place — as various guitars, drums and percussion sound makers were on display for kids to play with. The musical instruments came from the famous Surf Ballroom in Clear Lake.

## Ionia Fun Days kicks off run tonight

## Chickasaw County Farm Bureau holds annual meet-

Keynote speaker reminds members of the importance for farmers to be open about mental health

The 105th Annual 2023 Chickasaw County Farm Bureau Meeting was held on Monday, July 24, at the Chickasaw Event Center in New Hampton.

Almost 200 members attended the meeting that included a prime rib meal served by the Frederika Locker, the presentation of the ballot, the recognition of scholarship winners, door prizes handed out by Chickasaw County Farm Bureau and agent Curtis Franzen and guest speaker's Larry

Tranel discussion about the importance of mental health for farmers.

Those elected to the board during the meeting included President Katherine Balk, Vice President Jessica Grober, Treasurer Nolan Webster, Secretary Barbara Schwickerath, Voting Delegate Robert Shatek and Township Directors Adam Drewelow, Jordan Heit, Drew Dietz and Shannon Dietz.

Grober recognized the county's five

scholarship winners, who included Trinity Brincks, Eadie Suhr and Claire Sorensen of Fredericksburg, as well as Daniel Orthaus and Ashley Rosonke of New Hampton.

Tranel, a 33-year veteran of Iowa State University Extension who has worked with numerous farmers on financial management and production issues, talked about the stresses that farmers deal with in his program titled "Resiliency and Farmer Behavioral Health."

of government."

She also said the Biden Administration must take a much tougher stand against China — especially when it comes to the theft of intellectual property and growing ownership of U.S. land by Communist China.

China is the main reason Hinson said she supports increasing defense spending, not only to give service members pay raises but also so that the U.S. is ready for any future conflicts that might arise.

She discussed the need for not only the U.S. to invest in its semiconductor industry but also support American allies — naming Taiwan specifically — that are critical to the so-called "chip" shortage.

"It's why I've been so outspoken in making sure that we are supporting the Taiwanese military," she said and added that not only is the country dealing with a chip shortage but also must invest more heavily in its defense manufacturing sector. "It's not what it used to be."

Hinson said that as part of a war game recently conducted around a scenario of Chinese aggression against Taiwan, it was learned "pretty clearly we would run out of ammunition pretty quickly."

Hinson also touched on what she called the Democrats' "spending frenzy."

"Sometimes, we just have to say, 'Hey, we don't have the money,'" she said. "It's not always popular to say no but it is necessary sometimes."

She took a number of questions from the nine residents who attended the town-hall meeting that dealt with a variety of issues:

• She called President Biden's energy policy a disaster.

"We need to unleash American energy. We have so many options here at home," she said. We've had a rush to green energy [yet] we're still having energy shortages and rolling blackouts."

She also took a shot at Biden's push for electric vehicles; the Environmental Agency earlier this year said the goal was to have 67 percent of the cars sold in the U.S. to have zero tailpipe emissions by the year 2032.

"I think the obsession that this administration has with electric vehicles and switching

the switch on that overnight," she said, "is frankly unacceptable and unobtainable."

• Hinson also took issue with Biden's attempt to forgive student loans.

"I've been very clear about my position on this: I don't agree with wiping away debt because I think people need to pay the debt they own. They signed on the dotted line," she said, "but what I think is really important is we do take a look at predatory practices, for example."

"So if their are predatory people making loans — too high of an interest rate, too high of amount — and that needs to be a part of the discussion around education going from here."

When one audience member pointed out that millions in Payroll Protection Program loans were forgiven during the COVID-19 pandemic, Hinson had a quick response.

"But the difference was Congress approved that."

Asked about the proposed carbon pipeline that would go through parts of Chickasaw County, Hinson said that she is worried about the use of eminent domain, saying "I'm always leery" when it comes to the process.

But she also said she believed that "climate is changing; I sat next to a meteorologist for 10 years," referencing her former career as a television news anchor in Cedar Rapids.

"I think there's a very real challenge here in balancing the future of the ethanol industry ... while at the same time protecting the land value."

She said she was more interested in the research being conducted on the byproducts of carbon, pointing out that research is showing that carbon produces enhanced oil recovery.

"I support policies that I believe are more on the conservation and management side," she said, "rather than carbon taxes or overreaching [regula-

tions]."

Monday's town hall meeting in New Hampton kicked off a busy day for the second-term congresswoman as she also made an appearance at a meeting of the Charles City Rotary Club and toured the Cargill Kitchen Solutions in Mason City.

first three years, it was held in conjunction with the Big 4 Fair.

But when fair officials canceled the 2020 event because of the COVID-19 pandemic, Big 4 Chamber officials decided to go ahead and hold the event, and in the past two years, the event was held later in September.

At 5:15, the à la carte portion of the BBQ begins, and tickets for that can be purchased the

## Lining it up for a pass

The U.S. Drought Monitor's weekly report released on Thursday painted a worsening situation in the Nashua area as all of Bremer County and good chunks of Chickasaw, Butler and Floyd counties saw the drought intensity increase from "moderate" to "severe" in the past seven days.

The National Weather Service's Nashua reporting station had just 1.17 inches of rain in July, far off the 4.74 inches that usually fall.

## Judge dismisses charges against Nashua woman

Agnitsch, driving a 1999 Buick LeSabre, was working her rural route postal carrier job in her vehicle, a report filed in District Court by a Floyd County sheriff's deputy said.

She was northbound on Timber Avenue when she struck an eastbound semi-truck in the intersection with 270th Street, the report said. Both Agnitsch and the passenger, who was sitting in the back seat, were trapped and had to be extricated by Charles City and Nashua fire departments.

Agnitsch had serious injuries and was flown to Mayo Hospital in Rochester by helicopter ambulance. The passenger, who is also from Nashua, was taken by AMR ambulance to the Floyd County Medical Center in Charles City, but was soon transferred to Mayo.

Agnitsch was charged with serious injury by vehicle and OWI after authorities allegedly learned that she had tested positive for amphetamine/methamphetamine at Mayo while being treated for her injuries, court documents say.

Last Wednesday, Agnitsch's attorney filed a motion asking the court to rule on the admissibility of evidence that the prosecution planned to present at trial.

The motion said the Floyd County Attorney's Office

planned to call an unidentified employee of the Mayo Clinic Laboratory to lay the foundation for a one-page document that allegedly showed the results of a drug test, but that page was page 160 of a document with no indication of what was on the first 159 pages or how many additional pages followed it.

The motion also said that there were at least two subsequent drug tests performed on Agnitsch, but the state was not planning on introducing those as evidence, and the prosecution had "cherry picked" the page from at least 160 pages.

The motion also argued that the information was part of Agnitsch's privileged medical history, and had been obtained without a search warrant and without Agnitsch granting permission.

Last Thursday, July 27, on the day trial had been scheduled to begin and after a jury had been selected, District Court Judge Elizabeth Batey ruled that the witness should not be permitted to testify and was not qualified to lay foundation for the evidence being offered, so the proposed evidence was inadmissible.

As a result of that ruling the Floyd County Attorney's Office moved that the charges be dismissed, and Batey granted the motion.

# Harrington wraps up multi-sport career at Nashua-Plainfield

"That was a nice way to end my athletic career," said Harrington. "Getting all-state is something that not everyone can accomplish."

But for all the stats, box scores and trips around the basepaths, it was a freshman season that he got to play with his older brother Luke – a 2020 N-P grad – that meant more than any triple or home run could match.

"It was pretty cool my freshman year. I got to play with my brother," said Bo.

It was that same freshman season where Harrington starred in relief in an 6-5 upset win over New Hampton. He pitched five-plus innings – allowed zero earned runs – to take down the favored Chickasaws in a game that saw the Huskies cut down a New Hampton runner at home plate for the final out of the thrilling contest. N-P trailed, 5-0, at one point in the matchup with New Hampton.

"Dawson (Lamborn) was struggling pitching so I got thrown into that game and ended up pitching pretty well," said Harrington. "That was pretty cool as a freshman. I looked tiny as a freshman."

Harrington was also a part of N-P's wild, 15-14, victory over Rockford in a marathon, three-and-a-half hour district triumph in 2020 that lasted 10 innings. Harrington gave up six earned runs on the hill, but made the final out of the evening at second base to help N-P advance to the Class 1A district

semifinal.

"Probably the No. 1 thing I'd take away from baseball is just it's definitely the funnest sport. I got to hang out with all my friends, joke around, mess around before game time and walk in and compete," said Harrington.

That previous winter out on the hardwood, Harrington hit a game-winning shot over Riceville in 2020. Who was the timely assist from? None other than his brother, Luke.

One could make a serious case that Bo Harrington deserved all-state recognition in three sports during his tremendous athletic career at Nashua-Plainfield.


This past winter Harrington was snubbed by the Iowa Print Sportswriters Association, which named their all-state squads in March and did not include N-P's all-time single-season scoring leader on any one of its three teams.

"It would have been nice if I could have got it in basketball, too," said Harrington, who averaged over 23 points a contest his senior year at N-P.

He clearly was worthy of such a selection for his exploits out on the hardwood, but Harrington, like several athletes in the small-school class, didn't make the media's cut.

"Bo was a difference maker every single game he played. He is a special athlete and is a great person," said Miller.

Harrington was an excellent defensive back for the Huskies and head coach Andrew Christensen out on the gridiron.

He was an all-district performer in the secondary and also started at quarterback at N-P his final two seasons in football.

Harrington overcame a leg injury his sophomore season which prevented him from running track – which he did compete at his senior season and earned a seventh-place medal in the shuttle hurdle relay team this past spring.

"I think of 2021 when he missed the first half of the sea-

son, our team was 8-9. When Bo returned, we went 7-1 to end the season to finish 15-10," said Miller.

This is Miller's third Husky to achieve all-state status in his eight years at the helm of N-P. Austin Bienemann was tabbed third team all-state by the IHSBCA as a pitcher in 2021. Max Hillegas was selected by IABaseball as third-team utility all-state pick just last year in 2022.

# Harrington caps career with all-state honor

## Baseball coaches name N-P senior to Class 1A third team

Bo Harrington has many fond memories of his outstanding athletic career for the Nashua-Plainfield Huskies.

So it only seemed appropriate that Harrington would go out as an all-stater on the baseball diamond as the Iowa High School Baseball Coaches Association selected him to its third-team squad at the shortstop position in Class 1A.

"It's nice to know that you got recognized in a sport that I thought I played pretty good in," said Harrington. "It's a nice accomplishment."

Harrington will have many amazing achievements to look back on after a sensational senior season for the Husky was officially put in the records books this past summer.

Harrington was the second-best bat as far as batting average goes in Top

of Iowa East Conference with a .462 clip. Harrington led the league in triples (4), was third in slugging percentage (.712) and amassed 57 total bases – fourth-best in the conference. Harrington knocked in a team-leading 31 RBI and scored 24 runs.

"It's incredibly deserving for Bo to

finish his career as an all-stater. Bo is one of the top players we've had in my time here. Every time he was in the field, on the mound, or at the plate, you knew something special could happen," said N-P head coach Levi Miller, who was also selected TIC East Coach of the Year for 2023.

With a 3-4 mark and 2.72 ERA, Harrington was also one of TIC's best hurlers on the hill. Harrington struck out 60 batters in 36 innings pitched.

Harrington, a slick fielder at shortstop, led the TIC in assists with 45 – tied with Central Springs' Eddie Pruijn. Harrington committed just four errors in 75 total chances.

Harrington was perfect on the base-paths, stealing 16 bases in as many attempts. Harrington's on-base percentage was .543 – fourth-best in the league.

## CAMPING ON THE COURT, GRIDIRON

FALL SPORTS SEASON BEGINS AS HUSKIES LOOK TO BEAT THE HEAT AT FOOTBALL AND VOLLEYBALL CAMPS

Beat the heat?

That's a tough task in a hot and humid state such as Iowa.

That's why Mindy Foelske and her Nashua-Plainfield volleyball squad held its week-long camp – which culminated on Thursday of this week – when the sun started setting.

Getting acclimated to playing in hot gyms is a definite issue if one is not prepared to take on the humidity that can make gymnasiums like N-P's – which does not have air conditioning – feel like a sauna.

"I decided to hold a night camp this year hoping the gym would be a little cooler. Monday wasn't that bad, but as the week progresses it is warming up," said Foelske, in her third year as N-P head volleyball coach. "Mornings are also not something my girls are a fan of so I was hoping to get more out of them at night."

Foelske said she had about 40 attendees of the camp – which started with a middle-school camp at 5:30 p.m., followed by high schoolers at 7 p.m.

Foelske also has members of her squad that participate in band camp in the morning, so she said it was either deal with the afternoon heat during camp or workout in weather inside that isn't quite as balmy at night.

High school members of Foelske's varsity squad help instruct and teach junior high students in any number of drills prior to the start of their camp.

"We let the drills we do condition the girls. If we can practice in game-mode, conditioning should start to take care of itself," said Foelske.

Foelske also brought in former Osage coach Andie Olson to talk to her team during the first two days of camp. Olson helped guide Osage to numerous state tournaments in her tenure for the traditional-power Green Devils. She was also co-head coach at Charles City in 2020.

"She talked a lot to them about how they get what they put in...that this team is theirs, not the coaches," said Foelske.

Foelske, who saw her Huskies play to a 9-18 record last year, said her Top of Iowa East Conference bunch is stressing sets and moving the ball around.

"Passing – which we really struggled with last year – is a main focus, along with

serving," she said.

While the X's and O's are vitally important, these workouts that precede the official start of fall sports practice on Monday, also feature the type of environment that Foelske wants to foster in order to rack up the wins this fall.

"Camp is more focused on what kind of culture we want in our gym this year and how we get that," Foelske added.

Back again this season on Foelske's coaching staff are assistants Hannah Holthaus and Keegan Ulrichs.

N-P's season opener is scheduled to take place on Tuesday, Aug. 22 in a triangular at Jesup. New Hampton will also open its season among those three schools.

For the Husky football team and head coach Andrew Christensen, his on-the-rise program hits the practice field at 5 p.m. every night this week. N-P's drills and workouts – which feature about five separate water breaks – finish up around 7:30 p.m. The camp ends tonight (Friday).

Christensen's pigskin camp is a lot more than just getting your sweat on and getting game ready for when the first football game will take place at Postville on Thursday, Aug. 24.

There's filling out forms, getting physicals completed, taking instruction from coaches, treating your body right and getting mentally prepared for the rigorous

season ahead.

"I view it as that and getting kids accustomed to the heat. Plus, with us going 5-12, it gives the older kids a chance to be role models for the younger kids," said Christensen, in his fourth year at N-P.

Christensen also gets his first peek of his group as a whole. That includes seeing each student athlete's progression when it comes to succeeding out on the gridiron.

"You really start to see where kids are going to be. It is usually the first time where we can see everyone together as during the summer kids are pulled in so many directions this is the first time close to all of them are together," said Christensen.

Christensen, who helped orchestrate back-to-back playoff appearances for his Huskies last fall, said he has about 40 high school attendees of camp and 25 for middle school.

Time is of the essence and getting the opportunity for his Huskies to improve is also very important in the grand scheme of things.

"I think it is another chance for four more days to get better, both mentally and physically," said Christensen.

N-P's coaching staff is the same as it was last year. Those varsity assistants are Chase Sudol, Taylor Wedeking and Nick Henningsen. N-P's middle school coaches are Brad Theilen and Austin Newbrough.
