#### City voters approve LOST changes Voters in New Hampton gave the go-ahead for the city to use its

local-option sales tax, commonly referred to as LOST funds, to pay its fee to be part of a new county-owned ambulance service. The measure received 1,063 yes votes, or 76.6 percent, while 324

voted against the measure.

In the past, LOST funds were directed to infrastructure projects, which will still receive any remaining funds after the ambulance bill, which will be about \$350,000 in 2023, is paid.

#### **County still not** sure which fund will pay for its share of EMS

Attorney says supervisors can use 'rural money' for new service but supervisors hold off on decision

The Chickasaw County Board of Supervisors got the legal go-ahead Monday from County Attorney David Laudner to pay its portion of the new ambulance service with Rural Services Basic (RSB) funds, but board members took no action on how or if they'll contribute funds to Chickasaw County EMS.

"You've asked whether you can use RSB to cover these costs, and my answer is on the front page and it's yes if you make some determinations and some limits," Laudner told supervisors. "I'm not opining at all as to whether or not that's good policy ... that's up to you guys to decide. My only answer is a legal answer, not the political

The discussion about how the county would fund its portion of the service that is scheduled to begin on Jan. 1 came after board members approved a number of purchases — including liability insurance and laptop computers — and also approved two agreements with MercyOne New Hampton Medical Center.

Board members had asked Laudner to prepare an opinion on using RSB, which is funded through rural property taxes, to pay for ambulance service, and in a letter he wrote to supervisors, he said they could ... to an extent.

The idea behind starting a county-owned ambulance service began with the county paying 40 percent of the costs with the eight cities in the county contributing 60 percent on a per capita basis. When Alta Vista and Nashua decided not to join the new service, an agreement was reached in which the remaining cities would not be charged more with the loss of two cities.

Under 28E agreements the county signed with the cities of New Hampton, Bassett, Fredericksburg, Ionia, Lawler and North Washington, the cities agreed to pay the county the rates first proposed, but technically, the agreements only require to provide there service.

#### It's one down; one to go for New Hampton police

Chief tells City Council that its actions earlier this year help the department land new officer

New Hampton Police Chief Zach Nosbisch thanked the City Council on Monday night for actions it took earlier this year, actions Nosbisch said has moved his department closer to being at full strength.

During a short — like 13 minutes short — meeting, Nosbisch told the council that offer to join the force, effective Dec. 5.

"I think both expanding the radius and increasing the pay helped a lot," Nosbisch said, "and honestly, I'm not sure if this applicant would have accepted without them."

Earlier this year, the City Council bumped the pay of police officers by \$2 per hour and also changed a rule that stated city employees had to live within 10 miles of the city limits and bumped that radius up to 50 miles.

Sylvester, who currently

works as a guard at the state penitentiary in Anamosa, currently lives in Elkader but plans on moving to an area within the

50-mile radius. But Nosbisch told council members since the new officer's wife works in Elkader, without the 50-mile radius, he doubted Sylvester would have accepted the job offer without the rule

change. Following the meeting, Nick Sylvester has accepted an Nosbisch said that with the recent departure of Braxton Rash, who took a job as a deputy with the Chickasaw County Sheriff's Office, the department is currently "down" two officers, leaving the force with just four.

"It's been stressful, I won't lie," Nosbisch said, "but I know we're all breathing a sigh of relief that we know we have one coming on board soon."

He said testing and interviews will take place either late this week or early next week to get the sixth position filled as soon as possible.

#### Republicans dominate in Chickasaw County

will be joined on the board by fellow Republican Scott Cerwinske, the former Nashua city councilman who knocked off incumbent Tim Zoll in the June primary and ran unopposed in Tuesday's general elec-

That will leave the board with four Republicans and just one Democrat, Steve Breitbach, who won a March special election by just two votes.

Meanwhile, the GOP also got a win in the race for country treasurer as Matt Ysbrand received 2,837 votes, or 58.3 percent, to easily turn back Democrat Keith Hoey, who received 1,684 votes, or 34.6 percent. Jackie Bohr, who lost the Republican primary, mounted a write-in campaign, and although the Auditor's Office did not release the names of the write-ins, 349, or 7.2 percent, of voters did cast write-in ballots for the office.

Ysband will replace Sue Breitbach, the Democrat who announced earlier this year that she will retire at the end of the

The lone Democrat to win in the county was Recorder Shirley Troyna.

She received 2,891 votes, or 58.8 percent, while Zoll, who was nominated by a special Republican convention, garnered 2,016 voters, or 41 per-


Auditor Sheila Shekleton and County Attorney David Laudner, both ran unopposed. And Republicans dominat-

ed the rest of the county vote to, helping Charley Thomson win the Iowa House of Representatives District 58 race and current State Rep. Sandy Salmon claim the State Senate District 29 seat. Turnout for the election was

relatively high, especially for a mid-term election, as 5,026 ballots were cast, meaning 60.6 percent of registered Chickasaw County voters either voted early or headed to the polls on Tuesday. The Auditor's Office reported

that it received 2,153 absentee ballots by the time polls closed. Under a law passed in 2020, absentee ballots must be returned to the Auditor's Office by that time. All results from Tuesday's

election are unofficial until the Board of Supervisors canvas the election, which is expected to take place next week.

whether it costs you \$100,000, \$400,000 or \$4 million a year," he said. "You're responsible for of the money from the cities so if the money is sufficient to cover the service, then that's sufficient. Then you don't have to kick in anything, quite frankly. ... That's how the 28Es work."

Supervisor Jake Hackman, who has opposed using RSB to fund the new service, asked what happens if the county has to cover more than it's original costs?

"What my answer is that you can only use rural services money up to the extent that it's covering 'the rural people' based upon the proportion of the people that are part of the 28E agreements and the project in general. So if in fact the cities are paying X and you're rural services, if you decide, to pay Y and the bill is 2X and 2Y, then you're going to have find the rest of that money from somewhere else."

Hackman wondered aloud about the residents of the two non-participating cities if the county had to use General Basic/General Service funds to cover shortfalls.

"If it did have to come from GB/GS," he said. "what about the poor cities of Nashua and Alta Vista? Because they pay into GB/GS.

Laudner said "that's a political question, not a legal question. If they feel like there's legal if anyone wanted to make a action to be taken, so be it."

Board Chairman Matt Kuhn said that he supported using the RSB to fund the county's share.

"I support up to that 40 percent, which is what we did the service with the assistance the numbers off of, to come from rural Basic and County Betterment, as it is done now," he said. "If there's overages, if we need more than that 40 percent, then we have to do some thinking. Hopefully, we don't get to that point."

> He got support from both Byrne and Steve Breitbach.

"I'm with you," Byrne said. 'I think it's our duty to put in our portion as well ... however, we're doing it now."

Breitbach chimed in with just two words — "I agree."

Hackman, though, said before the county decides how to fund its portion of the service, the county needs to have a budget for the new service.

Chickasaw County EMS Director Joel Knutson said he has started working on a budget and when Hackman said the board needs to see a budget by next week, Knutson said he would try to have one ready.

Hackman also asked what would happen if rural townships decided to opt for EMS services out of Nashua or Elma, which will provide service to Alta Vista, and also brought up the 12 sections in the southeastern part of the county that currently use SEMS Ambulance

In the end, when Kuhn asked motion, the room went silent.

## Not a Christian holiday, but ...

#### The glory of the Lord should be our focus as we celebrate Thanksgiving

puffed sleeves having a turkey feast with Native Americans are the common images associated with Thanksgiving. Most Americans were taught about this event in school as children and can remember being involved in plays and pageants depicting the events of the "first Thanksgiving.'

While the holiday has long been perceived in this way, there are many reasons to question this picture of the event that the modern secular/ civic religious Thanksgiving is based on.

Based on modern scholarship, many historians and scholars are convinced that the history of Thanksgiving is much more complex than commonly depicted. Not only has the idea of the holiday as an originally Christian one been questioned, but the colonialism associated with the "first Thanksgiving" has recently become much more apparent and unmasked.

To understand whether Thanksgiving is truly a Christian holiday, one must examine the event behind the modern celebration of Thanksgiving, the Pilgrim practice of holding thanksgivings, and how the celebration became a national holiday of

#### The 'First' Thanksgiving

Pilgrims, not the Puritans, were the ones who settled in North America after arriving on the Mayflower in 1620. As Christian separatists, they left England to worship freely because of the persecution from the Church of England. Their trip across the ocean was perilous and many of the Pilgrims lost their lives on the

When they finally made it to the New World, many more of the passengers became ill and died. While the Native Americans did help the Pilgrims learn to survive, their relations with the newcomers were more complicated than is commonly depicted.

The Wampanoag tribe did enter a peace treaty with the Pilgrims but did so mainly to protect their own tribe. Also, in contrast to popular stories, the Native Americans did not pass on their land to the Pilgrims.

In September or October of 1621, the governor of the new settlement, William Bradford, declared a feast in celebration of their successful harvest. Although half of the original

Pilgrims with black hats and Pilgrims had perished, the remaining settlers celebrated

Pilgrims and members of the Wampanoag joined in the celebration, although most historians agree that the food and events of the feast are mainly unknown. The feast was a celebration of the harvest, but the Pilgrims did not recognize it as a new holiday to celebrate annually.

Also, there is very little documentation of the event, which proves it was not a major event that the Pilgrims chose to "mark on their calendars" for the coming years.

While the Pilgrims did worship the Lord and would have given thanks to Him for their harvest, the event known as the "first" Thanksgiving was a "harvest feast and not, as far as we know, an official religious day of thanksgiving.'

Surely, the Pilgrims would have recognized God's provision for the harvest and would not have specifically separated the sacred from the secular as people do today. However, there is no indication that the 1621 Thanksgiving celebration between the Native Americans and Pilgrims was a strictly Christian observance.

#### Thanksgivings to the

The Pilgrims had a long tradition, spanning back to their time in England, where they would observe times of suffering and times of plenty. During times of suffering, Pilgrim leaders would call for a fast and repentance of sins.

Likewise, in times of abundance and blessing, the people would collectively observe a time of thanksgiving, when they would offer praise to the Lord. An official day of thanksgiving was celebrated by the Pilgrims in 1623 because of rain after a long season of

This celebration was seen as an official day of thanksgiving when the grateful Pilgrims praised the Lord for the rain after suffering the effects of drought. Such "holidays," like the one in 1623, were sporadic and not held at the same time

After the Puritans arrived in Plymouth in 1630, they quickly enveloped the Pilgrims and their settlement, and the Plymouth Colony soon became mainly Puritan. Like the Pilgrims, the Puritans would sporadically recognize days of thanksgiving.

However, in 1668, the Plymouth Colony decreed an observation of thanksgiving to the Lord, for the colony's members to give thanks on the fourth Thursday in November. Evidently, this influenced the idea that Thanksgiving was a Christian holiday.

During the afternoon, they would say a prayer to give thanks and enjoy an abundant dinner. Through the influence of the Pilgrims and Puritans, celebrations of Thanksgiving would often include consideration of the poor, either by inviting them to the feast or the later practice of giving to

Thus, in this sense, the earlier celebrations of Thanksgiving were impacted by the religious observances of the Pilgrims and Puritans. However, the later development of the holiday moved away from the Christian influences to instead support a nationalistic agenda.

#### **An Official National**

Recognizing a day of thanksgiving was not restricted to the Christian communities. On October 3, 1789, George Washington proclaimed the last Thursday of November to be a day of Thanksgiving to give thanks to the "Almighty."

Although Washington was not a Christian, but a Deist, many people in the newly formed United States of America would have seen Washington's proclamation as referring to the Lord. Thanksgiving, as proclaimed by George Washington, would be a day of prayer to give thanks and ask God to help the nation.

Later, President Abraham Lincoln issued a proclamation on October 3, 1863, declaring Thanksgiving Day, the last Thursday of November, as a national holiday. He was urged on by Sarah Hale, who persistently campaigned for the holiday.

Lincoln hoped the observance of Thanksgiving would encourage a reunion of the nation during the Civil War. As the President that officially inaugurated the holiday, Lincoln is credited with making choose to abstain from cele-Thanksgiving a national holi-

Thanksgiving Day became enmeshed with the history of the "first" Thanksgiving in 1621, to provide a nationalistic narrative to the holiday. Especially in the 1800s and 1900s, children were taught about the events at Plymouth,

but with a simplistic view of the happenings.

The overarching idea was that the Native American Indians passed the land over to the new settlers, but this was not the case. Sadly, children in schools in the past and present were not taught about the colonialism behind the holiday and the bloody wars that followed the "first" Thanksgiving.

The colonies spread and thrived, eventually turning into America, at the expense and oppression of the Native Americans. As is noted in a theolog-

ical journal article about Thanksgiving, "We selectively recount the story of the pilgrims, their courage and valor, while at the same time selectively ignoring the cost their growing abundance and expansion meant for native peoples who were already living here even as some of us reap the benefits.

Americans need to keep this in mind on the day we give thanks for our land and coun-

There are Christian traditions associated with the day, but the official national holiday declared by Abraham Lincoln is not rooted in Christianity. day, since spending time with family and loved ones while giving thanks is important. However, believers should "give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thessalonians 5:18, NIV). Every day can be a day of "thanksgiving" to the Lord. Even though Thanksgiving

is not a Christian holiday, followers of Christ can choose to observe the day to the glory of God, thus making the day special even if other Christians brating the holiday (Romans Either way, the glory of the

Lord is the focus for Christians on Thanksgiving (1 Corinthians 10:31).

#### Here's Your 'Recession Survival' Checklist

It's unfortunate, but recessions are a fairly normal part of the economic landscape. When a recession occurs, how might you be affected? The answer depends on your individual situation, but regardless of your circumstances, you might want to consider the items in this recession survival checklist:

Assess your income stabili**ty.** If your employment remains steady, you may not have to do anything different during a recession. Assess your risk tolerance. If you find yourself worrying excessively about declines in your investment statements, you may want to reevaluate your tolerance for risk. One's risk tolerance can change over time - and it's important you feel comfortable with the amount of risk you take when investing.

Keep diversifying. Diversification is always important for investors — by having a mix of stocks, mutual funds and bonds, you can reduce the impact of market volatility on your portfolio. 





#### Applications open for heating bill assistance this winter

With the winter heating season around the corner, applications for the state-administered, federally funded Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program, or LIHEAP, are

The funding is available for those who are struggling financially and qualify for state assistance.

In addition to LIHEAP, there may be other assistance available. Customers are urged to contact their local community action agency about payment assistance options, as well as the state agency that administers low-income energy assistance.

To be eligible for LIHEAP in Iowa, the total household income for an applicant must be at or below 200% of 2022 federal poverty guidelines.

For example, a single-person household is eligible with an annual gross income at or below \$27,180. A family of four is eligible with an annual gross income at or below \$55.500. The program began taking applications October 1 for

those 60 years old or older and will accept applications beginning November 1 for all others.

The program accepts applications through April 30,



I can be my own worst critic at times and there are probably far too many occasions that I don't allow myself the best opportunity to succeed.

In closing, New Hampton finished strong and placed eighth overall in the girls race. Campbelle Kolbet also placed eighth individually and capped an incredible senior season that exemplified what hard work and aiming for your goals is all about.

Chickasaw senior P.J. Anderson also ran with plenty of heart as he had to overcome the always painful shin splints. He placed 50th – 15 spots better than his first run at state as a junior.

I enjoyed this meet probably more than I have compared to other state meets I've covered for other teams. Before I walked back to my car – a

large portion of fans, athletes and media members had long since gone. My former co-worker at the Courier -Scott Jackson – was still plugging away at his computer and talking to somebody on the phone. I shook his hand and went on my merry way.

And just as soon as the meet had begun, it was over. I almost had a sense of heartache over that fact. I wanted to prolong the moment. The road home is always a bittersweet





## REAPING THE REWARDS

CHICKASAWS HAVE NINE FIRST-TEAMERS, THREE HONORABLE MENTION SELECTIONS

After putting together its best season since 2017, New Hampton reaped the rewards when it came to all-district football as the Chickasaws had 12 players honored, including nine players being named to the first team and another trio who received an honorable mention selection.

Topping the list was Class 2A, District 3's Offensive Player of the Year Award winner in Braden McShane. The junior running back was joined on the first team by wide receiver Hunter Serie, defensive end Aiden Roberson, linebackers Ben Tenge and Isaac Howe, defensive back Evan Knowlton, "utility" player Brady Speltz, offensive lineman Gatlin McCumber and punter Carter Steinlage.

The Chickasaw honorable mention selections were linemen Daniel Orthaus, Logan Fettkether and Marshall Zeien.

"All of those guys in my mind were definitely worthy," New Hampton coach Scott Frerichs said. "There's always that feeling you'd like to get a few more kids honored, but I think when you have this many boys on all-district it shows you that the coaches thought we had a really good football team."

New Hampton finished the

season 6-3, and the wins were the most by a Chickasaw team since the 2017 team went 8-3 and advanced to the state playoff quarterfinals. And New Hampton was just a few plays from being 9-0 and advancing farther in the playoffs. A loss to Osage very well may have turned on a holding call, and in losses to Clear Lake and Waukon, New Hampton was a play away from taking the lead late in both games.

"We had a great year, and I'll say it, this was a team that was better than 6-3," Frerichs said after the season ended with a heartbreaking 24-22 playoff loss to Waukon. "A break here, a break there and we could be 9-0 right now. We played in a really good district and had a tough schedule."

Howe was also a solid receiver and rusher as he caught 13 passes for 172 yards

and had 137 rushing yards. Serie had a breakout senior season as he caught a team-leading 17 passes for 200 yards while making 15.5 tackles on defense.

Speltz was solid in the defen-



sive secondary — as he posted 10 tackles and picked off two passes. In his first year as the Chickasaws' starting quarterback, he was 65-for-106 passing for 869 yards and three touchdowns and also added three rushing TDs. He also threw for nine two-point conversions.

Roberson was another strong two-way player for New Hampton as he was excellent at "setting the edge" on defense and coming up with 13 tackles while making seven catches for 136 yards on offense.

Knowlton joined McShane, Tenge and Howe as repeat all-district players, and finished the season with 28.5 tackles and a pair of interceptions.

Steinlage made the team as a punter — averaging 32.4 yards a punt and often effectively pinning opponents inside the 20-yard line. The senior also was a solid receiving threat as he caught 14 passes for a team-leading 233 yards, and on defense, he led the New Hampton secondary with 32.5 tackles.

"We had an excellent senior class, there's no doubt about that," Frerichs said. "They were great leaders for our team, they loved the game and they worked at it. They will be hard to replace, not just because they're good football players, either. That love for the game was a big part of our team."


the fellas.

It wasn't really a suggestion because he was already headed toward the door, and sure enough, there was a card game or two or three going on.

I walked in behind Dad, thinking maybe I should introduce him to the guys, but if there was one truth about Mel Fenske, it was this: He was most at home when he was with his fellow veterans.

Before I could say a word, he was introducing himself to the veterans of Forest City.

I knew at that very moment that I had lost, and that my office — my sparkling, pristine office — was no match for a group of veterans and the stories they could swap.

"You play cards, Mel," Bob Rollefson asked? "Is the Pope Catholic?"

And with that, Dad sat down at the table and said, "Hey, you go get some work done and I'll be over in a little bit, OK? I'm just going to play a hand or two."

Two hours later, my cell phone rang.
My wife at the time asked me if I was
teaching my dad how to put out a paper?
"He's at the Legion," I told Robin, and
she couldn't help but laugh.

"That's your Dad to a T; tell him Nadine got up from her nap and she's wondering if her husband is going to ever return."

I trooped the two "storefronts" down to the Legion and told dad that we needed to get home. One of his new-found best friends had to leave, and they were in the middle of a game of 500.

"Hey Bobby, sit down and help me finish these guys off," he said. "It should only take a hand or two."

So I sat down, thinking we had like 450 or so points and I looked at the score sheet and saw we were at 450 ... a minus 450.

We hung on for about five or six hands — and about five or six dozen stories in between hands — before we finally went out ... as in reaching a minus 500.

A couple of months later, Dad would be gone, and as we greeted friends, family and enough Legion members to form a division, I looked up and saw six or seven guys from the Forest City American Legion.

I hadn't cried much, but for some reason, seeing those guys — knowing that they had given my dad one of the best days of his waning life — opened the tear ducts.

On these pages are the names of hundreds of veterans from Chickasaw County, some who served the Union in the Civil War; some who are serving our county today.

Each year that we put out this Veterans Day Commemorative Edition, I see those names and realize that each one was or is someone's favorite veteran.

My favorite veteran isn't from Chickasaw County so there is no Melroy W. Fenske listed on these pages.

But I think his story is like so many others who are listed on these pages.

He grew up on a farm near the small southern Minnesota town of Gibbon — home to the coolest eight-lane bowling alley and the famous Gibbon Ballroom.

Dad enlisted in the Air Force soon after graduating from high school in 1951, and found a way of life he loved.

Well, after basic training at Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, Texas, he did.

"Hottest six months of my life," he told me one day, and I looked at him with a strange look. "Geez, Dad, how many times did you fail basic training?"

"Trust me," he replied, "when you're running around in 100-degree heat, you lose all track of time."

But he made it through basic and went on to serve his country until 1972.

The service was my Dad's life. He met his wife, my mom, in London. My older sis-

ter was born in the British capitol. I came along a few years later and said hello to the world in a hospital on an Air Force base in Wiesbaden, West Germany.

Dad was proud of his service, at a time when it was easy to serve. He volunteered to go to Vietnam, a war that tore this country apart. When he came home, they told him that it might not be wise to wear his uniform.

"The hell with that," he said. "I'm proud to be an American serviceman. Period."

It's been 17 years since Dad has told me a service story — be it about the many bowling tournaments he participated in, representing the Air Force, or the time he came to the base housing in London and told my mom that he was going to be gone for a while and he'd be home as soon as he could.

It was October 1962, and only 10 days later did my mom and her fellow service wives find out about the Cuban Missile Crisis

I guess what I'm saying is I miss my favorite veteran, and as we get ready to celebrate Veterans Day, I'd like you to do me a favor.

Thank your favorite veteran.



## No regrets for this veteran

#### PETHOUD STAYS CONNECTED WITH FORMER MILITARY LIFE THROUGH THE AMERICAN LEGION

Ron Pethoud laughed when he was asked about the number of times he moved during his long career in the United States Air Force.

"Well, let's put it this way, when we moved to New Hampton, it was probably the first time Catherine [his oldest daughter] ever got a chance to re-arrange her room," he said, "because before that, we moved every two or three years. It's a different life, the service is, and families go through a lot."

But Ron Pethoud has no regrets about choosing the service back in 1986.

He was a year away from graduating from Harlan High School in southwest Iowa when he went through the Air Force's "delayed enlistment" program.

"Basically, I signed up, went to school for my senior year and then went to Lackland for basic training," the New Hampton resident said. "The idea was it would help me get my college paid for, and honestly, I was a kid who probably needed to grow up and mature a little."

But the Air Force turned into a career for Pethoud, and he still got plenty of his college covered — earning an associate's degree, a bachelor's and two master's degrees (in criminal justice and military science — while serving his country.

He spent much of his Air Force career with security forces, beginning as a law-enforcement officer and then serving in nuclear security. He spent years overseas — including three years in England and four tours in the, as he put it, the "desert."

For 27 years, Pethoud traveled the country and the world. He met his wife, Shannon, in Cheyenne, Wyoming, and both his children — Catherine, a senior at New Hampton High School and Ron III, who goes by RW and is a high school freshman — were born while he was serving his country.

"I think one of the things that people don't always

understand about the service is how much your family goes through," Pethoud said. "We joke about Catherine's re-arranging her room, but we moved to New Hampton when she was in sixth grade and it was her fifth school she had attended. I'm so appreciative that they supported me. Families are the unsung heroes in the military."

When Pethoud retired in 2014, he landed a job with the Farm Service Agency, which brought him back home to Iowa, albeit in a different corner of the state.

He is one of the more active members of the American Legion Fae Stine Post 38, and it's not an uncommon sight to see Pethoud at events ranging from Veterans Day and Memorial Day observances to parades to serving on the color guard at various sporting events.

In other words, he's a big believer in the Legion in particular and all veterans groups in general.

"I think it's one of those things where you find that same camaraderie you had in the service," he said. "We've been through the same things, we've faced a lot of the same challenges and obviously the Legions and VFWs and the groups do a lot for veterans."

Veterans Day is a special day for Pethoud, and not just because it's a day in which he and millions of other Americans who have served in the Army, Air Force, Marines, Navy and Cost Guard are honored.

"I love Veterans Day," he said, "but then again, it's my son's birthday so that's another big reason to love Nov. 11."

But he also appreciates one more thing about his son's birthday.

"You know, it is nice when people come up and say thank you," he said. "It means a lot to all of us veterans, and it's appreciated. I went into the military to grow up and help get my college paid for, but I got so much more out of it. Even without the thank yous, I'd have no regrets, but it's nice to hear people appreciate what you did."





35-22 win over the Cougars, but what made the game special wasn't the stats or even the score; instead, it was the fact that the two teams kicked off at 7 p.m. and didn't hear the final horn until 1:06 the following morning.

So the reporter posed the question: If I would have told you back then you'd be doing what you do now, would you have believed it?

"The attorney part, definitely, and the army part, probably," Stochl said with a laugh, "but the jumping out of airplanes? That might have been a different story."

Ten years after that football night that would never end, Stochl is serving his country as a member of the U.S. Army's Judge's Advocate General's Corps. He's come a long way in a relatively short amount of time — graduating from Central College in 2017, finishing law school at the University of Iowa in 2 1/2 years, getting married, having a son and rising to the rank of captain.

And he wouldn't have it any other way.

"I always knew I wanted to be a lawyer," he said during the recent phone interview from his home near Fort Bragg, North Carolina, "and the more and more I thought about it, the more and more the JAG Crops felt like the right fit to me."

He recalled interning at a law firm and asking one of the firm's attor-



neys what her goal was for the next year.

"I still remember her saying something like 'I really hope I get to do a deposition' and that really hit me," he said. "I mean, I wanted to be a lawyer, I wanted to get right into it. And with the JAG Corps, that's exactly what I get to do."

THE ARMY TOUTS the JAG Corps with a quick and catchy slogan: "Join a Firm Unlike Any

On goarmy.com, it spells out what lawyers in the Army do.

- It defends the Army and its Soldiers in all military legal mat-
- It provides important legal advice to senior Army officials.
- Its licensed attorneys and judges, called Judge Advocates, fight for justice at home and around the globe.

But what really hooked Stochl was what the website terms "the army lawyer advantage."

Right there in black and white it says, "make an immediate impact" by gaining litigation experience and taking on meaningful casework that would take years to get in a civilian firm."

The JAG Corps also offers attorneys like Stochl a chance to rotate through different legal disciplines giving him a wide range of experiences.

The day before the interview, for example, he wrapped up a threeday trial in which he prosecuted a sexual abuse case.

"I've had the chance to do a lot of things I know I wouldn't have been able to do in a civilian firm," he said, "and that's what really drew me to JAG. I didn't want to write memos for partners for 10 years. I can't think of a better way to start a legal career than with what I get to do here."

#### HE ENTERED MILITARY service after a whirlwind weekend

in May 2017.

He played his last baseball game for the Central Dutch, asked EmmaGrace Walter to marry him, received his Central diploma and headed to basic training.

"I got engaged, graduated, left for the Army and when I came home, I started law school," he said. "Yeah, kind of a busy weekend, kind of a busy summer."

While he headed to law school, his fiance finished up her final year at Central — EmmaGrace graduated in three years — and then set off for Des Moines University to earn a degree as a physician's assistant.

Even after they were married in May 2019, the Stochls lived in separate cities - Noah in Iowa City and EmmaGrace in Des Moines

– but the fact that Noah had an internship with the U.S. Attorney's Office in Des Moines helped.

"We're both very goal orientated people so we knew we'd have to get through that part," he said. "We went into it eyes wide open.'

Stochl, though, had a decision to make. Would he remain in the National Guard, work in a field like intelligence and practice law in the civilian sector or would he go into active service as a member of the JAG Corps.

And in the end, he chose to join a firm unlike any other.

IN SOME WAYS, Noah Stochl is blazing his own trail.

Yes, his father has built a career in the law — first as an attorney and now as a district court judge, but the Stochls are not a family steeped in military tradition.

Yet, he says his parents — Rich and Kathy - taught their oldest son values like "love of country" and "love of service."

"I don't think they were really surprised that I went into the military," he said, "and I think when it came right down to it, neither was I. It's something — I wouldn't say I was called to do — I thought would fit for me.'

Granted, he probably doesn't want to relive his basic training days at Fort Jackson in South

a drill sergeant."

WHEN HE MADE the decision to join that firm unlike any other, it was - as he puts it - a "joint decision."

"You know, there's no way the Army works if EmmaGrace wasn't for it," he said. "It's a different life. There's a chance we'll get moved around. OK, that's just a at and then getting yelled at more fact, right? I am really grateful that the old man out. because someone did something she was willing to 'sign on' for this because it isn't always easy.'

Today, EmmaGrace Stochl works as a physician's assistant at an urgent care clinic near Fort Bragg, and the couple stays busy not only with their careers but with their 18-month-old son, Owen.

"He's always on the go, hitting golf balls, running around like a crazy man," Stochl said. "He's fun being around, but I'll tell you, I'm glad he takes naps because he tires

**FORT BRAGG IS** one of the

world's largest military installations in the world, with more than 54,000 military personnel. It is home to scores of units, including the famed 82nd Airborne Division.

And that is how Stochl became a paratrooper.

"It's kind of a badge of honor around here," he said, "and you know if you don't have your airborne wings, I don't know if I'd say they look down at you ... well, trust me, they do."

So he went through airborne school not just to earn that badge of honor but because one day, he may literally have to jump out of a plane in a combat zone to answer legal questions Army officers might have.

"I wouldn't say I'm used to it," he said with a laugh, "and I haven't done it a lot but let's just say, the 11 or so times I've jumped, yeah, there's been an adrenaline rush. I'll tell you this much, landing's

THE FUTURE IS bright for the young Stochl family, but where it leads is anybody's guess.

They enjoy returning to Iowa, and Noah Stochl especially enjoys returning to his hometown each summer for the Josie's Midsummer Classic.

"I watched my dad and grandpa play in it for years," he said, "and it's just like a tradition. Trust me, unless I'm deployed, which very well could happen, I'll be back every year. It's like the perfect homecoming."

In many ways, he's still competing, just like he did in high school, when he played football, basketball golf and baseball for the Chickasaws.

"It's one of the things I really love about the law," he said. "It's competition."

He does, however, lose out to one member of the family when it comes to military rank.

One of the Stochls' dogs is named Captain, and based on the date of rank, the four-legged captain out ranks the two-legged one.

"Yeah, I can't get around that one," he said with a laugh.

But as much as he enjoys the almost year-round golf that North Carolina provides, he's just as happy that he took up the Army and joined that firm unlike any other.

"I think it's the best experience for a young attorney," he said. "It's different, don't get me wrong. It is very formal, we have rules and regulations that are different, and our soldiers have more rights probably, but I'm learning a lot. We'll see where it goes from here, but I can tell you this much ... I have no regrets."








## The history of a holiday filled with 'thank yous'

Shortly after the annual Veterans Day observance came to an end at Nashua-Plainfield High School last year, Dan Bilharz was stopped for a quick interview —

"It's probably my favorite part of the program," the Nashua VFW quartermaster said, "so I've got time for one or two questions ... at the most."

That's because he had a receiving line to get to.

It's tradition at Nashua-Plainfield to have two Veterans Day programs, one is put on by the students of the elementary school while the second takes place in the high school gymnasium, and when the latter is complete, when the firing squad has done their salute just outside the gym doors, the Nashua-area veterans gather in the corner of the gym and scores of students go through the line.

"I think what gets to me the most is that it's so genu-

ine," Bilharz said, "and for a lot of us guys, that means the world to us because some of these fellas didn't get a very nice welcome home back in the day. To have young high school students shake your hand and look you in the eye and say 'thank you for your service' means the world to us."

**VETERANS DAY IS** a holiday that doesn't "move around" on the calendar.

Each year, it is celebrated on Nov. 11. It doesn't move to the second Monday or the last Monday; it's always on Nov. 11, the day that marks the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month when World War I unofficially ended

World War I – known at the time as "The Great War" - officially ended when the Treaty of Versailles was signed on June 28, 1919, in the Palace of Versailles outside the town of Versailles, France. However, fighting ceased seven months earlier when an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, between the Allied

nations and Germany went into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. For that reason, November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of "the war to end all wars."

In November 1919, President Wilson proclaimed November 11 as the first commemoration of Armistice Day with the following words: "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations...'

The original concept for the celebration was for a day observed with parades and public meetings and a brief suspension of business beginning at 11:00 a.m.

The United States Congress officially recognized the end of World War I when it passed a concurrent resolution on June 4, 1926, with these words:

Whereas the 11th of November 1918, marked the cessation of the most destructive, sanguinary, and far reaching war in human annals and the resumption by the people



of the United States of peaceful relations with other nations, which we hope may never again be severed,

Whereas it is fitting that the recurring anniversary of this date should be commemorated with thanksgiving and prayer and exercises designed to perpetuate peace through good will and mutual understanding between nations; and

Whereas the legislatures of twenty-seven of our States have already declared November 11 to be a legal holiday: Therefore be it Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives concurring), that the President of the United States is requested to issue a proclamation calling upon the officials to display the flag of the United States on all Government buildings on November 11 and inviting the people of the United States to observe the day in schools and churches, or other suitable places, with appropriate ceremonies of friendly relations with all other peoples.

AN ACT APPROVED May 13, 1938, made the 11th of November in each year a legal holiday — a day to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be thereafter celebrated and known as "Armistice Day."

Armistice Day was primarily a day set aside to honor veterans of World War I, but in 1954, after World War II had required the greatest mobilization of soldiers, sailors, Marines and airmen in the Nation's history; after American forces had fought aggression in Korea, the 83rd Congress, at the urging of the veterans service organizations, amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting in its place the word "Veterans."

With the approval of this legislation (Public Law

380) on June 1, 1954, Nov. 11 became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

Later that same year, on Oct. 8, President Dwight D. Eisenhower issued the first "Veterans Day Proclamation" which stated: "In order to insure proper and widespread observance of this anniversary, all veterans, all veterans' organizations, and the entire citizenry will wish to join hands in the common purpose. Toward this end, I am designating the Administrator of Veterans' Affairs as Chairman of a Veterans Day National Committee, which shall include such other persons as the Chairman may select, and which will coordinate at the national level necessary planning for the observance. I am also requesting the heads of all departments and agencies of the Executive branch of the Government to assist the National Committee in every way possible."

On that same day, President Eisenhower sent a letter to the Honorable Harvey V. Higley, Administrator of Veterans' Affairs (VA), designating him as Chairman of the Veterans Day National Committee.

In 1958, the White House advised VA's General Counsel that the 1954 designation of the VA Administrator as Chairman of the Veterans Day National Committee applied to all subsequent VA Administrators. Since March 1989 when VA was elevated to a cabinet level department, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs has served as the committee's chairman.

THE UNIFORM HOLIDAY BILL (Public Law 90-363 (82 Stat. 250)) was signed on June 28, 1968, and was intended to ensure three-day weekends for Federal employees by celebrating four national holidays on Mondays: Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Veterans Day, and Columbus Day. It was thought that these extended weekends would encourage travel, recreational and cultural activities and stimulate greater industrial and commercial production. Many states did not agree with this decision and continued to celebrate the holidays on their original dates.

The first Veterans Day under the new law was observed with much confusion on Oct. 25, 1971. It was quite apparent that the commemoration of this day was a matter of historic and patriotic significance to a great number of our citizens, and so on Sept. 20, 1975, President Gerald R. Ford signed Public Law 94-97 (89 Stat. 479), which returned the annual observance of Veterans Day to its original date of Nov. 11, beginning in 1978.

This action supported the desires of the overwhelming majority of state legislatures, all major veterans service organizations and the American people.

Veterans Day continues to be observed on Nov. 11, regardless of what day of the week on which it falls.

The restoration of the observance of Veterans Day to Nov. 11 not only preserves the historical significance of the date, but helps focus attention on the important purpose of Veterans Day: A celebration to honor America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good.

THAT BRINGS US back to that receiving line that one sees every year when Nashua-Plainfield students say thank you.

As Bilharz stood in that line in 2021, he smiled more than a few times.

"Sometimes a simple thank you," he said, "is just perfect."

A couple of hours earlier, he sat in the multi-purpose room at Nashua-Plainfield Elementary School and a young student walked up to him and said, "Thank you for what you did."

The veteran smiled; in fact, his face beamed.

"You're welcome, young man."

And that is a Veterans Day memory that will last a




